#### Commissioner Urges Adoption of Similar Way on Dogfish—Good Words for New Brunswick and Its People

(Toronto News Correspondence)

Augusta, Me., Nov. 30.—If, as alleged, initiation is the sincerest kind of flattery, Canada will be flattered indeed by the efforts being made here to follow the lead of the dominion. Government in looking after the interests of the Atlantic coast fishermen. The governor of the State of Maine has just received a report from C. L. Donovan, Joseph, Maine, a retired master seaman, who was commissioned to visit the three reduction works established and maintained by the Canadian government for the purpose of destroying dogfish which interfere seriously with Atlantic coast fisheries. Mr. Donovan was greatly impressed with what he saw and has reported on the advantages of a similar plant on the coast of Maine. The governor will lay the report before the federal government at Washington and will urge the establishment of a \$25,000 plant without delay.

The Canadian works accomplish a two-fold purpose. They were continued war against the dogfish, which destroy everything with which they come in contact, fish as well as seals. They also furnish fertilizer to the farmers with the result that farms in the district of the fish are greatly improved. The government pays the fishermen for the dogfish at the rate of 1 1/2 cents apiece, which is just sufficient inducement to them to bring in the fish to be destroyed. The livers are then taken out and treated separately for the production of oil, while the remainder of the fish is ground up, dried, mixed with nitrogenous materials and the fertilizer produced is sold at \$20 per ton for use on Canadian farms. In the United States such fertilizer is worth \$25 per ton, but the Canadian government sells it to Canadians at the fixed price and limits the amount to five tons per man. Mr. Donovan reports that the results have been extremely gratifying. In conversation with your correspondent, he said that New Brunswick and Nova Scotia were in many ways ahead of the State of Maine.

"In the first place the New Brunswick fish is better than ours," he said. "Then you have better farmers. In the third place, you have a better climate. Our boys in Maine are for the most part a little better than the boys who bring up to believe that they should not work. We have a lot to learn from the boys in New Brunswick and the two other Maritime Provinces."

The plant, which it is proposed to build in Maine would, probably be larger than any of the Canadian plants, which cost about \$12,000 each. It is estimated that the sale of fertilizer would pay approximately 30 per cent of the cost of the plant.
