WAR TAX BILL IN NOVA SCOTIA LEGISLATURE

Special Rate of One Mill on The Dollar to Be Levied


A bill providing for a provincial war tax was introduced in the Nova Scotia legislature this week by Premier Murray. In answer to a question by Mr. Tanner, the premier explained that the bill followed largely legislation that had been adopted in other provinces. It dealt with one phase of taxation of this sort and there were of course other sources for the use of which subsequent legislation could provide.

The bill is entitled an act to levy a war tax to supplement the revenue of the province. In brief, it provides that in every incorporated town and municipality there shall be levied a special rate of one mill on the dollar on all property and income rateable thereunder under the assessment act, and also there shall be a similar levy in every city on all property and income rateable for city purposes. This tax is to be levied and collected in the same manner as if it were a rate for local purposes and it is to be paid over to the provincial treasury. Where the rate for the fiscal year has been determined, the mill of the provincial war tax shall be added thereto.

To Aid Britain The bill, gives the various reasons for its introduction. It says that Nova

Scotia has granted and may grant assistance in aid of Great Britain and her allies in the present war, and that the war has already been the cause of considerable reduction in the ordinary revenue of the province and will probably hereafter result in a further reduction of such revenue. There has been heretofore no provision for the levying and collection of a provincial tax, and it is necessary and expedient, at this time, that such provision be made and that a rate should be imposed on all the rateable property in the province in order that the burden may be evenly and equitably distributed.
