

Rev. J. H. Ritson, D. D., general secretary of the British and Foreign Bible Society of London, England, was the speaker at the morning service in Centenary Methodist church yesterday. In a strong address he dealt with conditions as he had found them in Europe during his recent trip and spoke of the crying need which existed there. Turning to the work of the Bible Society, he said that the Bible at present was printed in 528 languages, nine of which were added last year. He said it was to the glory of the English-speaking race that all through the war the British government had permitted the Bible Society to send £225 a month to maintain supply of Bibles for the enemy of the British race.




