GIRL'S STORY LEADS TO TWO ARRESTS

Head of Order of Owls and Head Nurse in Its Hospital.

South Bend, Ind., Feb. 26—John Talbot, supreme president, Order of Owls, was arrested today on an indictment charging conspiracy of the white slave laws and conspiracy.

The information on which the indictment was returned was furnished by Miss Pearl Bagley, of Topeka, Kas., who says she was lured to South Bend and then forced to submit to terrible practices.

She says that before she could escape from the Owl hospital, in which she was held and which she refers to as a "house of fear" Talbot and his emissaries had clipped her hair so as to prevent her escape.

So soon as she escaped from the hospital, Miss Bagley said, she made frantic to the police and sheriff to lock her in jail so she could not be rescued by Talbot. Her request was granted.

Mrs. Pearl Spangler, head nurse of the Owl Hospital, has also been arrested on similar charges.
