

Exports, Montreal, \$222,150,361; St. John, \$64,381,749; Halifax, \$15,991,704; Quebec, \$811,978.

Imports, Montreal, \$94,140,647; Şt. John, \$7,443,699; Halifax, \$1,173,319; Quebec, \$9,031,393.

The totals, Montreal, \$316,291,008; St. John, \$71,825,448; Halifax, \$23,165,023; Quebec, \$9,843,371.
