RENNER PRAISES FRANCE AFTER HE SIGNS THE TREATY

"Conquered in War," He Says, But "Free of Dynasty Whence no Man of Worth Had Sprung."

Paris, Sept. 10.—Dr. Karl Renner, head of the Austrian peace delegation, departed from Vienna this evening at 7:20 o'clock.

Signing the Austrian Treaty.

After the ceremony Dr. Renner, during the course of an interview, said: "If France lends us aid, the name of St. Germain will soon evoke in our hearts feelings which will alleviate the bitterness of the hour we have just passed." The head of the Austrian delegation cent country. What he admired most began by praising France as a magnificent: First, the French peasant; second, the French press and continued: "Austria cannot hate; it always respects the man with whom it has to fight. We are the conquered. Yet, misfortune has given us liberty, freed us from the yoke of dynasty, whence for three generations no man of worth has sprung, freed us from bonds with nations which were never in understanding with us, nor with ourselves. Pointing out Austria's needs in coal and raw material, he said: "We are independent with an independence which cannot be alienated; yet, we depend on the Czechs and Poles for coal, on Banat for cereals, on Italy for maritime commerce."

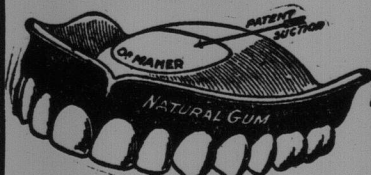

QUICK ACTION OF RETURNED SOLDIER SAVED BOY'S LIFE

Exhibiting truly soldierly qualities, presence of mind and prompt action at a critical moment coupled with personal bravery, Douglas Thompson, a former member of the "Fighting 268th," saved Albert McCabe, a small boy of less than six years of age, from death by drowning yesterday afternoon.

Mr. Thompson, a customs officer, returning after dinner to the Atlantic Sugar Refineries where he was yesterday engaged in weighing sugar was attracted by the actions of two small boys at the edge of the Charlotte street extension wharf opposite the Pender Wall Works. Running across the street, he discovered a third boy just going down in the water and, throwing off his coat and vest, he plunged in after the young lad. He caught the boy a few feet under water, brought him to the surface and swam with him to the edge of the wharf where he held him for a few minutes until others who had reached the scene were able to assist both the boy and his rescuer from the water. Mr. Thompson immediately put into use his first aid training of army days and was able to get almost all the water from the boy's lungs by a few minutes' brisk work. The boy was then sent to his home at 122 Britain street and Dr. Baxter summoned.
