Mr. Hill from the Committee to whom was referred

the subject of continuing a Geological survey of the

Province, submitted their Report, which they

read, and handed the same in at the Clerk's Table,

where, was again read, and is as follows:

"The Committee, appointed by Resolution of the

House of the 27th inst., relating to the expediency

of continuing the Geological survey of the Province

already commenced by Doctor Abraham Gesner,

have attended to that duty, and beg leave to submit

the following Report:

"Among the advantages to be derived from an

accurate Geological survey of the Province, which

occur to your Committee, are the following:—It

would disclose the mineral wealth of the Province,

make known its hidden resources, and prevent im-

proper losses of Mines at a nominal or greatly

undervalued rent. It would give to the Province

a character abroad, and induce the migration of

capital; contribute to the improvement of Agriculture,

by securing a scientific analysis of the soil in

different parts of the Province; by the discovery of

Marl and other fossil, and mineral manures; by

furnishing a knowledge of the adaptation of certain

manures to certain soils; and of particular soils to

certain crops.

"A period of about four years would, probably

be sufficient to complete an accurate Geological

survey of the whole Province.

"The annual expense of the person engaged in

this service would probably amount to £250,

including his own travelling and out-of-pocket

charges, hire of men, boats and carriages, forages,

postages, mining tools, philosophical implements,

chemical apparatus, furnaces for analysing min-

erals, and other incidental expenses, exclusive of

any remuneration to the individual performing the

service.

"Your Committee, therefore are of opinion that

great benefits would result to the Province by a

continuance of a Geological survey of the same,

and that this service cannot be performed by any

competent person for a less sum than £250

including all expenses.
