RAIN HAS DONE MUCH GOOD ALL OVER PROVINCE

The welcome rain continued yesterday, and although the downfall at any one time was not heavy, during the day the total precipitation was half an inch, which made nearly one and a half inches since Tuesday morning, and the drought seems to be effectively broken. The two days' rain no doubt resulted in the water rising in the small streams throughout the province, and many small operators will likely benefit, especially if the wet weather holds out for a day or two longer. When questioned yesterday concerning the cause of the blight on the cedar trees, William McIntosh, curator of the Natural History Society, said those which he had examined appeared to be affected by the drought. Those trees growing in rocky or shallow soil seemed to suffer the most, and any one of these species might be suffering from lack of moisture. He had not looked particularly for insects on the affected trees, but it would be quite natural that the trees were being attacked by different insects and parasites. The cedar was commonly bothered by the fir saw fly, the cedar mite and a number of scale insects, and any one of these species might appear in large numbers when the life of the tree was being gradually sapped out by drought.
