Sir John A. Macdonald moved, seconded by Sir Leonard Tilley, That this House do immediately resolve itself into a Committee to consider certain proposed Resolutions respecting Fees and charges to be paid for the registration of deeds and instruments in the North-West Territories.

Sir John A. Macdonald, a Member of the Queen's Privy Council, then acquainted the House, That His Excellency the Governor General, having been informed of the subject matter of this Motion, recommends it to the consideration of the House.

Resolved, That this House do immediately resolve itself into the said Committee.

The House accordingly resolved itself into the said Committee.

(In the Committee.)

1. Resolved, That the Governor in Council shall fix, from time to time, the Fees and charges to be paid for the registration of deeds and instruments.

and charges to be paid for the registration of deeds and instruments.

2. Resolved, That the salaries of Registrars shall be fixed by the Governor in Council, and shall be payable out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of Canada; but

no such salary shall exceed twelve hundred dollars a year.

3. Resolved, That whenever the registration Fees and charges collected or collectable by any Registrar in any two years consecutively amount to more than fifteen hundred dollars a year, as ascertained by the quarterly Returns and Report of Inspector hereinafter mentioned, the salary of such Registrar shall cease to be so payable, and thenceforth he may retain to his own use all the fees and emoluments received by him in each year.

4. Resolved, That the salary of the Inspector of Registry Offices shall not exceed twelve hundred dollars a year, and shall be payable out of the Consolidated Revenue

Fund of Canada.

5. Resolved, That the Sheriff may, subject to the approval of the Lieutenant-Governor, appoint Deputy Sheriffs, who shall be paid such Fees as are appointed by a schedule to that effect made from time to time by the Governor General in Council.

6. Resolved, That section eighty-nine of the said Act be hereby amended by striking out the following words, "To District Registrars, not exceeding \$1,000."

Mr. Speaker resumed the Chair; and Mr. Haggart reported, That the Committee had come to several Resolutions.

Ordered, That the Report be now received.

Mr. Haggart reported the Resolutions accordingly, and the same were read, as follow:--
