By whom and where they shall be kept.

Sec. 29. The arms and accourrements of non-commissioned officers and men of Volunteer Companies shall be kept by them, except in cases where the Commander-in-Chief shall direct them to be kept in Armouries. as he may do; in which case, if there be no Public Armoury in which he shall direct them to be kept, the Captain of the Company shall provide a proper place, and may be allowed annually a sum not exceeding five pounds for so doing and for taking care of such arms and accoutrements.

Officers' Arms.

Sec. 30. Commissioned Officers of the said Companies shall furnish their own arms and accountements.

Exemption of Arms, Horses, &c., from seizure.

Sec. 31. The arms and accourrements of the Officers and men of such Volunteer Companies, and the Horses used by them as such, shall be exempt from seizure in execution and from distress and assessment, nor shall any such horse be disposed of by any officer or man without leave of the officer commanding the Company.

How Volunteer Companies shall be drilled and exercised. Sec. 32. The Volunteer Militia Companies shall
