taining the Bounty to forfeit 100%. of such Fish, or shall enter any such Fish for the Purpose of obtaining any Bounty thereon, contrary to the true Intent and Meaning of this Act, then and in every such Case the Person or Persons so offending, shall, for each and every such Offence, forfeit the Sum of One hundred Pounds.

Bounty to be paid as other Bounties on British Fisherics:

XI. And be it further enacted, That the said Bounty upon the Importation of such Fish shall be paid and allowed in such and the like Manner, and under such and the like Conditions, Rules, Regulations, Restrictions, Penalties, and Forseitures, as any Bounties on the Importation of the Produce of the British Fisheries may, by any Act or Acts of Parliament now in force, be paid and allowed, so far as the same are applicable thereto, and the several Clauses, Powers, and Directions, therein contained, shall, and are hereby directed and declared to extend to, and shall be respectively applied, practised, and put in Execution, for or in respect of the Bounty hereby allowed, as far as the same are applicable thereto, in as sull and ample a Manner, to all Intents and Purposes whatever, as if all and every the said Clauses, Provisions, Powers, Directions, Penalties, and Forseitures, were particularly repeated and re-enacted in the Body of this present Act.

Act to continue in torce till Aug. 1, 1807. XII. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall continue in force until the First Day of August One thousand eight hundred and seven.
