

FELL, JOHN. (*East Victoria.*)

B. 21 Jan., 1819, at Baysdale, Ingleby, Greeshow, Yorkshire, Eng., where his father resided as a tenant farmer. Ed. at the Village School, Ingleby, and Kildale. M., 1842, Jane Carling, of Crathorne, in Yorkshire, and during the twelve succeeding years lived on a small rented farm at Guisbro. Came to Can. in 1854, and settled in Cavan, Co. Durham. Removed to Somerville, 1859. Is a farmer and saw and shingle mill owner. Was Reeve of Somerville for eighteen successive years, and has been Warden of the Co. of Victoria for four years. Re-elected Reeve of Somerville, Jan., 1887. An unsuccessful candidate for North Victoria at g.e. 1879. First returned to Leg. Assem. for that seat at g.e. 1883. Re-elected for present seat at last g.e.. A Liberal Conservative.—*Bury's Green, Ont.*

FERGUSON, ROBERT. (*East Kent.*)

B. 1834, in parish of Kilsyth, Stirlingshire, Scot., and ed. there. Unmarried. Is a lumberman. Has been a Councillor, Reeve and Warden of his Co. First returned to Leg. Assem. June, 1885, to fill vacancy caused by the death of the sitting mem., Mr. McCraney. Re-elected at last g.e. A Liberal.—*Thamesville, Co. Kent, Ont.*

FIELD, CORELLI COLLARD. (*Northumberland West.*)

Father and mother, natives of Somersetshire, Eng., came to Can. in 1834, and settled in Cobourg, Ont. B. in Tavistock, Devonshire. M., 1859, Miss Hossack. Is a merchant. Has been a Public Sch. Trustee, and Chairman of the Board for twelve years, Town Councillor for ten years, and Mayor of Cobourg in 1886. First returned to Leg. Assem. at last g.e. A Liberal.—*Cobourg, Ont.*

FRASER, Hon. CHRISTOPHER FINLAY, Q.C., (*Brockville.*)

S. of Mr. J. S. Fraser, of Brockville, Ont. B. there 1839. M., Miss Lafayette of the same town. Called to the Bar, U.C., Trinity Term, 1865. Apptd. a Q.C., 1876. Is a Bencher of the Law Soc., Ont. Is Presdt. of the Catholic Literary Asso. of Brockville. Was one of the originators of the Ontario Catholic League. Is a director of the Ontario Bank. Appointed a mem. of the Ex. Council 25 Nov., 1873, and was Provl. Secy. and Registrar from that date until 4 April, 1874, when appointed Commr. of
