called the "Tobago Keys." Here my personal observation leads me to say, there would be no more than ordinary difficulty and expense; and although the situation being considerably within the line of reefs, is by no means so desirable as that of Sail Rock, still as one of these islands is of considerable height, a building upon it, of moderate elevation, would sustain a light visible to a distance sufficiently great to enable vessels to avoid all dangers in that quarter.

ONE Lighthouse situate on Bacolet Point, in the parish of St. George, about one mile Encl. in No. 14. and a quarter from Scarborough.

The Date at which the Lighthouse was erected? Commenced in March 1842 and finished at the latter end of the same year.

The original Cost thereof, and from what Funds defrayed? The expense was 838 l. 4s. 61 d., and defrayed from the funds of the local Government.

The Annual Expense since its first erection, and from what source the same was paid? The average annual expense is 115 l., and is paid out of monies received as tolls; or if they be deficient, then by the local Government.
