Port Credit Pioneer Dies In Hospital

PORT CREDIT — Pioneer Port Credit resident Mrs. Kathleen Mary Parsons, MBE, died last Wednesday, Jan. 3 at Oakville-Trafalgar Memorial Hospital.

Mrs. Parsons earned her MBE in 1934 from King George V for her outstanding service to her community.

Born in London, Ont., in 1888, Mrs. Parsons was educated at Notre Dame Convent in Montreal and eame to this district in 1914.

She established the Port Credit child welfare clinic in 1925 and was president of the Canadian National Institute for the Blind for many years.

She was also the founding president of the South Peel unit of the Canadian Cancer Society.

The former Kathleen Pocock, Mrs. Parsons was the wife of the late William F. B. Parson. She is survived by her daughters Marv Agnes and sons Gerard, Phillip and Louis; and her brother, Louis O. Pocock. Her son, John, predeceased her.

Mrs. Parsons' son, Lou. is councillor for ward 2 on Mississauga council. R e q u i e m mass was con-celebrated Monday morning at 11 o'clock from St. Mary's Church by her cousin, Archbishop Phillip F. Pocock of Toronto; nephew Rev. Gerald Pocock of Hamilton; and Rev. Francis O'Reilly, pastor of St. Mary's.

Music for the funeral was provided by St. Michael's Cathedral Chowr.

Mayor Tom McCallum of Port Credit and R. Douglas Kennedy, MPP for Peel South, were among mourners at the funeral.
