Gentlemen:-

In reply to your letter of the 30th ultimo, inquiring as to whether or not any provision is made for supplying woods for the use of the Micmac Indians in Nova Scotia and also whether or not your clients' claim for woods taken from him, or from his property, can be entertained, I beg to inform you that this Department disclaims all ^{liability} ~~liberty~~ for the alleged acts of Indians in trespassing on private property.

In some cases where resident Indians have no wood for fuel, the Department has come to their relief.

The Indian Agent at New Glasgow is the Rev. J. D. McLeod who can give you any further information required on the subject.
