on suitable land privately owned.

- (e) The utilisation of the services of Belgian experts in forestry and the reafforestation of spoil heaps, &c. for the reafforestation of spoil heaps in this country.
- (f) Schemes for the employment of Belgian craftsmen, so as not to compete with British industries, as for example in the erection of houses and the manufacture of furniture and other commodities required for the Belgian Co-operative Settlement.
- (g) Schemes for finding temporary employment, pending repatriation, for refugees of the professional classes, and others who are not elegible for assistance by the Labour Exchanges.
- (h) Schemes for facilitating the work of repatriation.

The suggestion of the voluntary Committee is that they should act as the delegates of the Government Committee, with such assistance, financial or otherwise, and with such authority as may be necessary for effectively carrying out the work entrusted to them. The sole object of the present proposals is to facilitate in any way possible the difficult tasks which have been entrusted to the Government Committee.
