Vanuary 1940 as a Sgt. Recommended for a commission in 1941 /7 he was turned down because he only had two years High School education. As a result he studied at Brighton Toc in his spa re had difficulty getting back overseas because of his age but finally returned in September 1944 and landed on the Continent in February 1945. He served with 1st Corps Troops and then later with CAOP. He applied for Interim Army but was rejected

This is a long outstanding record of service. Is it to be wiped out entirely because of these unfortunate episodes?

What he s been misapplied of public property? We bought cigarettes until recently at the rate of 300 for one dollar. At that rate the 24000 which he has told you about would cost eighty dellers. Forty-eight thousand would cost double that. Is that small amount somet ing for which this man's outstanding record should be wiped out—for which he should lose his rank—ahold have a stigma attached to is name—and should lose all with his service is so very great?

Consider the nature of this offence, its spaced eccurrence, the fact that it has been ignored if not condened as a general to do anyone as injury or to deprive the men under his of anyone thing to which they were entitled ——and taking all this into consideration along with the effect of the punishment which you decide to award, and having done that Centlemen I trust that you will be lenient with this officer.
