might be eached somewhere on the premises, so we searched the house. L/Spl Atkinson found 640 Brithish Consols eigarettes in sort of a cupboard underneath the stairsteps. As the OC and QMS were out I took it on my ul-shoulders to mark the cigarette packages, and with the help of L/Cpl Atkinson and Spr Pierce we marked each package one by one, by slitting the bottom of the cellophane and putting a small ink mark with a pen. We then the eigarettes back in the cartons and placed placed them back under the stairs in the same place as we found them. I then ordered L/Cpl place as we found them. I then ordered L/Cpl Atkinson and Spr Pierce to say nothing about this incident to anyone. I then decided to place a guard to watch for anyone coming in or going out, with Spr Pierce taking the first shift, myself the second and L/Cpl Atkinson the third. Nothing happened duing the night. The next morning at about 0830 hrs, the 8 AUG 46 I ordered L/Cpl Atkinson to lock himself in my room and watch anyone coming in or going out of the back door of our house as the front door of the back door of our house as the front door was bolted. He could see the back door direct from the window in my room as it is only a few feet (C). away or he could sit on the bed and watch the door by means of a mirror I had placed in the window frame. I then had to go to Slough on duty

The markings on the bottom of these 24 pkgs of British Consols cigarettes (Exhibit "A") and these 2 pkgs (Exhibit "B") are identical to the markings we put on the cached cigarettes.

The Accused declines to cross-examine this witness.

THIRD WITNESS FOR THE PROSECUTION M-50327 L/Cpl Atkinson G B on strength No 7 Cdn Artizan Works Coy REE having been duly sworn states:

I, M-50327 L/Cpl Atkinson G E live in house 18 at Subalcoupe Earracks, Borden in company with Sgt Saterlee, Spr Stanley, Spr Pierce and Spr Bugnet. At approx 1700 hrs Wednesday 7 ABG 48 just after coming in from work I opened my cupboard and discovered that I had lost most of my cdgarettes, 800 to be exact. I informed Sgt Saterlee at once, then went to supper. After supper on the chance that the eigarettes might be hidden, I started to look around in the unused cupboards underneath the staircases. I found some eigarettes (640). I called Sgt Saterlee and he came and had a look then the suggestion that they be marked and put back was made. Sgt Saterlee, Spr Fierce and myself marking them. Sgt Saterlee then told us to keep watch. We kept watch in turns all night but no one came during the night. Thurds ay morning the 8 th of AUG 46 as it was raining no one went to work, but in the afternoon everyone except myself went out to work. I stayed and kept watch in Sgt Saterlee's room which looks down on the back door, the front door had been locked, so no one could come in that way. At approximately 1500 hrs I say Spr Stanley, enter the back door. Then I heard noise like someone moving about underneath the stairs, if and then move to one of the other rooms where there was a clang like someone opening and shutting a stove. Shortly after I say Spr Stanley come out of
