

would be at the point marked "G2" on Agent Halliday's blue print, on the western side of Wakeman's Sound and about one and a half miles from the mouth of the river. The application for Sat-ain (G3) was not endorsed; as to Malad (G4) the witness recommended that 10 acres be granted on the bay, in such a position as not to interfere with the Timber Limit -- on the small bay to the north of Ellen Point, Kingcombe Inlet. The applications for Hall-gai (G5) and Nya-kai-gwis-muk were not recommended.

No 1 application (Keogh) was not recommended, as the witness thought these Indians already had sufficient land for all present requirements. As to the application in respect to Eway Reserve No. 4, all the lands asked for were found to be taken up with timber limits, in addition to which the witness thought the Indians had sufficient land thereabouts for their necessities, and hence he declined to recommend the application. There was no recommendation either of the applications for lands at Gagayukwaleas (all under Timber Limit), Awagi and Kismasis. Application D6 was for Magwekstala, a small point on the Eastern side of Burley Bay, adjoining Lot No. 487. He recommended that 10 acres be granted on the eastern shore of a small bay lying to the northeast of Pulp Limit No. 487, on MacKenzie Sound. With respect to Hikums, the whole of Watson Island, there was an old village site there where the houses had been burned down and one of them rebuilt last fall. Some of the Indians lived there continuously during the summers and had done so during the last fifteen or twenty years. The land asked for was on a pulp limit, but he thought that 10 acres might be set aside on Hoptoun Passage, taking in the small bay and the village site on the southern shore of Watson Island, without any particular harm being done to the holders of the pulp concession. In consequence of the land asked for being already taken up, the applications

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
