

The collegiate begins in the first week of September and ends the first week of July.

At the end of each quarter, Reports are sent to the parents informing them of the state of their children, as to their health, conduct, and application to study.

### ADMISSION.

On the admission of a pupil, parents are requested to furnish: 1st, a certificate from the Principal of the last educational establishment he attended; 2nd, all the informations calculated to enhance the good direction of the pupil.

It is of the utmost importance that the pupils be present on the very day of opening; delays would be prejudicial, as the course of studies is organized on the next day.

### TERMS OF BOARD.

Board for the scholastic year, payable in advance in four terms: A term already commenced is due in full.

No deduction is made for absence, unless for expulsion or protracted sickness that is one month or more.

The Board dates from the 1st or 15th of each month, according as the pupil entered in the first or last half of the month.

Washing, is payable in advance.

Physicians' fees, Medecines, Intrumental Music, Navigation, Telegraphy, Drawing, and Stationery form extra charges.
