High School, Moncton. Entered the service of the Bank, 7th January, 1913. Enlisted, May, 1916, from Winnipeg branch, in 212th Canadian Battalion, with the rank of Private. Transferred to 97th Canadian Battalion, and later to the Royal Canadian Regiment. Served at the front for over a year.

Killed in Action at Passchendaele, 30th October, 1917.

WILSON, HARVEY JAMES MUSSON—Driver. Born 1st December, 1899, at Toronto, Ontario, Canada. Father, Harry J. M. Wilson (deceased). Educated at Huron Street Public School and Jarvis Collegiate Institute. Entered the service of the Bank, 1st March, 1916. Enlisted, 15th December, 1916, from Market, Toronto, branch, in 67th (University of Toronto) Battery, Canadian Field Artillery, with the rank of Driver. Transferred to 3rd Battalion, Canadian Machine Gun Corps, August, 1917. Principal actions: Passchendaele, 1917; Arras, Monchy, Drocourt-Quéant Line, Amiens, Cambrai, Mons, 1918. Gassed, and shrapnel in the head and back, 8th September, 1918. Demobilized, 1st April, 1919. Returned to duty with the Bank, 22nd May, 1919. Retired from the service of the Bank, 15th September, 1920.

WILSON, JOHN—Private. Born 10th March, 1897. Entered the service of the Bank, 29th June, 1912. Enlisted, August, 1915, from Stationery Department, Head Office, Toronto. Gassed. Returned to duty with the Bank, 6th May, 1919. Retired from the service of the Bank, 31st May, 1919.

*WILSON, JOHN WILSON—Lieutenant. Born 12th December, 1896, at Enniskillen, Ireland. Father, William Wilson, Farmer. Entered the service of the Bank, 9th May, 1913. Enlisted, 1st September, 1915, from Cranbrook branch, in 54th Canadian Battalion, with the rank of Private. Transferred to 6th Battalion, Royal Irish Rifles. Promoted Lieutenant. Service: In France, 1916; in Egypt, 1917. Wounded (France), 1916.

Killed in Action in Egypt, 27th December, 1917.

WILSON, ROY WELLINGTON—Private. Born 16th April, 1899, at Caledon East, Ontario, Canada. Father, William R. Wilson, Farmer (retired). Educated at Orangeville High School. Entered the service of the Bank, 28th July, 1915. Enlisted, 8th February, 1917, from Smith's Falls branch, in 73rd Battery, Canadian Field Artillery, with the rank of Gunner. Transferred to Princess Patricia's Canadian Light Infantry, 7th May, 1917. Principal actions: Hill 70, Lens, Passchendaele, 1917; Amiens, Arras, Bourlon Wood, Cambrai, Mons, 1918. Wounded in the right leg (slight),
