REFORMERS IN RUSSIA Fasy to Cure TAME

WHAT THE ZEMSTVOS ARE AND WHAT THEY ARE ASKING.

te Changes in the Direction of Com stitutional Government Are Demand Do Not Sympathize With Nibilists About to Dawn for People of Russia?

It is the belief of many that a new political and economic era is at han It is the belief of many that a new political and economic era is at hand in Russia and that constitutional Government will come ere long as the result of the movement led by the presidents of Zemstvos or local assemblages. The memorial adopted by these presidents at their recent meeting in St. Petersburg created a deep impression upon the Czar when presented to him by representatives of the Zemstvos, and the prediction is made that the abolition of the bureaucratic system is not far away. bureaucratic system is not far away. This system, the Zemstvos memorial declares, has caused estrangement be-

the people and the supreme and destroyed that confidence of the people in their Government which is so essential to a healthy national life.

The Russian Zemstvos originated about forty years ago in the reign of Alexander II., being an evolution

from the primitive commune and municipal corporation. They are lo-cal elective bodies, and such duties as the construction of public works, building of roads, regulation of public health and education come under their jurisdiction. The members are chosen for three years, and three classes of voters participate in their election. The voting classes include landed proprietors, burghers, mechanics and peasants.

These assemblages have come grad-

ually to represent the aspirations of the people to possess a voice in the Government of the Empire, but the bureaucrats of the Imperial Court bureaucrats of the Imperial Court have constantly sought to repress the Zemstvos and curtail their grow-ing powers. The Zemstvos' repre-sentatives stand for freedom of con-science and of the press, freedom of speech and freedom of meeting and association. They also ask for the speech and frection of meeting and association. They also ask for the creation of some elective body through which the people may make known their needs and participate in legislation. In the presentation of their memorial to the Emperor it is held that an important victory has been gained for progressive ideas in Russia, for the opinion of the Zemstvos that the continuation of the Emstvos that the continuation of the bureaucratic system and a policy of harshness and repression must in the end spell revolution and ruin has been expressed in concrete form and leid before the Czar.

According to a Russian newspaper, The Novosti, thirty-four of the eighty-seven Russian provinces now have legally constituted Zemstvos. The presidents, while themselves landed proprietors, take a patriotic stand in regard to matters affecting the interests of the peasantry and lower classes generally. They are

not hostile in their attitude to the Imperial authority itself and are not in sympathy with any revolutionary agitation. The strongest friend of the Zenstvos is the new Minister of the Interior. Prince Svietopolic Mirsky. The bureaucrets are seeking to influence the Emperor to resist the demanda for liberal measures. Fortmost among the reactionaries are M. Pobedonostsefi, Chief Procurator of the Holy Synod, and the Grand Duke Sergius, Governor-General of Moscow, and both uncle and brother-inlaw of the Emperor. The Grand Duke is quoted as speaking contemptuously of the Zemstvo Congress, saying, "These peasants think, I suppose, that Russis exists for them as a dog does for its fleas."



A HOME SHAMPOO.

Washing the hair is a task most wo-men dislike, and even the girl who can least afford the dollar a month necessary to a professional shampoo pre-fers to pay it at a sacrifice rather than bother to wash her own hair. Yet if the work is gone about in the right manner at home it need not be difficult

manner at home it need not be dimcult at all.

The first thing is to prepare a shampoo liquid. Take a square inch of some good soap, shave it fine and dissolve it in half a cup of hot water. Then add a teaspoonful of violet ammonia and the raw white of an egg. Beat these thoroughly and strain through a wire sieve. Now stand with the head over a basin, pour a little of the shampoo over the scale and rub the shampoo over the scalp and rub briskly with both hands. Use all the liquid in this way, rubbing it thoroughly on the scalp. After this wash the scalp with several basins of warm water and then wash the long hair in the basin of water. Rinse by holding the head over the bathtub and pourthe head over the bathtub and pouring over it a stream of warm water,
keeping this up until the water that
drips from the hair is perfectly clean.
Then dash with cold water to close the
pores and prevent taking cold.

You are now ready to dry the hair.
First wrap it in a thick towel sha
ments the threepostly. Then spread a dry

First wrap it in a thick towel shall wring thoroughly. Then spread a dry towel across the back, throw the hair back and rub the scalp well and dry. It may take some time, but it is the best possible means of drying, acting as a massage too. Call in the aid of the sun if possible, but never use steam. Do not brush the hair until it is thoroughly dry. Then, as you brush, raise the hair, that the strands may be separated. After this combing will not be difficult, and when the hair is ready to go up it will be soft and fluffy.-Chi cago News.
