NATURAL ENEMIES.

There are two enemies which deserve especial notice, and, from the good service they do, should be known by sight to every cultivator. They are the Fiery Ground-beetle or Cut Worm Lion (Calosoma calidum, Fab.)—Fig. C.—and the Black Ground Wasp (Ammophila luctuosa)—Fig. D. Both of these are desperate enemies of cut worms, the former feeding on them in all of its stages, the latter digging them out and storing its nest with them as food for its young grubs.
