THE DOMINION PRESBYTERIAN.



Any even numbered section of Dominion Lands in Manitoba or the North-West Territories, excepting 8 and 20, which has not been home-steaded, or reserved to $p^{-y_{Hol}}$ wood lots for settlers, or for other purposes, may be homesteaded upon by any person who is the sole head of a family, or any maile over 18 years of age, to the extent of one quarter section, of 160 acres, more or less.

ENTRY.

Entry may be made personally at the local land office for the district in which the land to be taken is situate, or if the homestender desires, he may, on application to the Minister of the Interfor, Ottawa, the Con-missioner of Immigration, Winnipeg, or the local agent for the district in which the land # situate, receive authority for some one to make entry for him. A fee of \$10,00 is charged for a homestend entry.

HOMESTEAD DUTIES.

A settler who has been wanted an entry for a homestead is required by the provisions of the Dominion Lands Act and the amendments thereto, to perform the conditions connected therewith, under one of the following plans:-

 At least six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land each year during the term of three years. in

In each year during the term of three years. (2) If the father (or mother, if the father is deceased) of any person who is eligible to make a homestead entry under the provisions of such person as a homestead, the requirements of this Act as to real-dence prior to obtaining patent may be satisfied by such person residing with the father or mother.

(3) If a sottler was entitled to and has obtained entry for a second homestead, the requirements of this Act as to residence prior to obtain-ing patent may be satisfied by residence upon the first homestead, if the second homestead is in the vicinity of the first homestead.

(4) If the settler has his permanent residence upon farming land owned by him in the vicinity of his homestead, the requirements of this Act as to residence may be satisfied by residence upon the said land. The term "vicinity" used above is meant to indicate the same town, township or an adjoining or cornering township.

A settler who avails himself of the provisions of Clauses (2), (3) or (4) must cultivate 30 acres of his homestead, or substitute 20 head of stock, with buildings for their accommodation, and have besides 80 acres substantially fenced.

acres substantially fenced. The privilege of a second entry is restricted by law to those sottices only who completed the duths upon their first homesteads to entitle them to patent on or before the 2nd June, 1889. Every homesteader who fails to comply with the requirements of the homestead law is liable to ave his entry cancelled, and the land may be again thrown open for entry. APPLICATION FOR PATENT should be mcds at the end of three years, before the Local Agent, Sub-Agent, or the Homestead Isspector. Before making application for patent, the settler must give six months notice in writing to the Com-missioner of Dominion Lands at Ottawa, of his intention to d^o so. INFORMATION.
