THE CANADIAN NORTH-WEST HOMESTEAD

REGULATIONS.

Any even numbered section of Dominion Lands in Manisoba or North-West Territories, groupting 8 and 25, which has not been b Steaded, or reserved to puvide wood lots for settlers, or for purposes, may be homestcaded upon by eary person who is the nois of a family, or any maile over 18 years of age, to the artest of quarter section, of 160 acres, more or less.

ENTRY.

Butry must be made personally at the local land office for the dis-trict in which the land is situate. HOMESTEAD DUTIES.

A sottler who has been granted an eatry for a homertead is required by the provisions of the Dominice Lands Act and the amendments thereto, to perform the conditions connected therewith, under one of the following plans:-

(1) At least six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land each year during the term of three years.

(2) If the father (or motifier, if the father is decreased) of the ho steader resides upon a farm in the vicinity of the land entered the requirements as to residence may be satisfied by such person siding with the father or mother.

(3) If a settler was entitled to and has obtained entry for a second omestead, the requirements of this Act as to residence prior to obtain-ing patent may be astisfied by residence upon the first homestead, if as gecond homestead is in the vicinity of the first homestead.

The second homestead is in the vicinity of the first noncestead. (4) If the settice has his permanent residence upon farming land owned by him in the vicinity of his homestead, the requirements of this Act as to residence may be satisfied by residence upon the said land. The term "vicinity" used above is meant to indicate the same town, township or an adjoining or cornering township. A settler who avails himself of the provisions of Clauses (2), (3) or (4) must cultivate 30 acress of his homestead, or substitute 20 head of stock, with buildings for their accommodation, and have besides 80 acres substantially fenced.

The privilege of a second entry is restricted by law to those settlers only who completed the dufts upon their first homesteads to entitle them to patent on or before the 2nd June, 1889. Every homesteader who fails to comply with the requirements of the homestead law is liable to ave his entry cancelled, and the land may be again thrown one for entry. APPLICATION FOR PATENT

should be made at the end of three years, before the Local Agent, Sub-Agent, or the Homestead Inspector. Before making application for putent, the settler must give six months' notice in writing to the Com-missioner of Dominion Lands, at Ottawa, of his intention to do so.
