KILLED. St. Thomas—Pte. William McGuire. Believed Killed London—Pte. Thomas Chandler. Wounded. St. Thomas—Pte. W. H. Headley. Sarnia—Driver George Cox. Galt—Pte. W. R. Smith (severely). Seriously Ill. Teeswater—Pte. George Colvin. London, Feb. 27.—Miss Mary Chandler, of 9 Charles street west, this city, has received official notification from Ottawa that Pte. Thomas Chandler, No. 491274, who had previously been reported missing, is now reported killed in action on September 16 last.

St. Thomas Casualties. St. Thomas, Feb. 27.—Pte. W. H. Headley, of the 91st Battalion, has been reported wounded. The wound is not serious. William B. McGuire, son of Mr. and Mrs. William McGuire, 18 Erie street, formerly of the 91st Battalion, has been killed in action on the Somme. Pte. McGuire left St. Thomas with the 91st, in which battalion were two of his brothers, Ptes. James Edward and Robert Gordon. Pte. McGuire was born in Oil City, Lambton County, and came to St. Thomas three years ago with his parents, and was employed at the M.C.R. shops when he enlisted.

Sarnia Man Wounded. Sarnia, Feb. 27.—A meager message to Abraham Cox, of Campbell street, brought the information this morning from Ottawa that Driver George Cox, No. 20888, had been wounded on February 7.

Galt, Feb. 27.—Mr. and Mrs. F. R. Smith, of Mill Creek, were advised yesterday that their son, Pte. Wm. R. Smith, 236805, aged 23, had been admitted to hospital on February 14 with a severe gunshot wound in the shoulder. He enlisted at Hamilton with the C.M.R. and had been a resident of Galt eight years.

Has Pneumonia. Teeswater, Feb. 27.—Mr. William Colvin, of the fourth concession of Colross, received a cablegram from England yesterday that his son, George, who is with the 160th (Bruce) Battalion at Branshot, was seriously ill with pneumonia.
