THE INITIAL STEP.

Elsewhere in this issue of the Nugget will be found the full text of the amended order in council of April 21st, 1902, defining the rights now enjoyed by Treadgold and his associates. A few days ago we dealt with certain objectionable features of the concession at which time it was pointed out that the concessionaires are allowed a limit of six years before they are compelled to begin operations—but meanwhile so far as the generation of power from the waters of the Klondike is concerned no other individual or company will be allowed to make use of the river for that purpose. That is to say, Treadgold and his associates are so situated that they may prevent the use of the water of the Klondike for the purpose of power generation for a period of six years and moreover toward so employing the stream themselves. It will be observed also upon careful reading of the order that no provision is contained therein by virtue of which the concessionaires are compelled to sell their water to the individual miner.

Treadgold and his associates is at once apparent. A government system maintained for the benefit of the miners and with charges placed at the lowest possible rate consistent with installation and operating charges is the one feasible plan thus far suggested.

The Yukon territory contains the greatest working placer fields in the world. Of this fact there is, and can be, no doubt. Such being the case the only reason for a lack of prosperous times must be of an artificial nature.

The News editorialist asserts that he understands the Treadgold concession from beginning to end. If such is the case any school boy ought to be able to comprehend it.

AMENDED TREADGOLD ORDER.

Text of Objectionable Grant, the Annulment of Which is Sought From the Government by a Petition Carrying Four Thousand Signatures.

The following is the full text of the amended order-in-council dealing with the Treadgold concession: Extract from a report of the committee of the Honorable the Privy Council, approved by His Excellency on the 21st April, 1902.
