THE INITIAL STEP.

Elsewhere in this issue of the Nugget will be found the full text of the amended order in council of Apri 21st, 1902, defining the rights now enjoyed by Treadgold and his associ ates. A few days ago we dealt with certain objectionable features of the concession at which time it was pointed out the concessionaires are allowed a limit of six years before they are compelled to begin operations-but meanwhile so far as the generation of power from the waters of the klondike is concerned no oth er individual or company will be allowed to make use of the river for that purpose. That is to say Treadgold and his associates are so situated that they may prevent the use of the water of the Klondike for the purpose of power generation for a period of six years and moreover toward so employing the stream themselves. It will be observed als upon careful reading of the order that no provision is contained with

water to the individual miner. Also we direct particular attention to the fact that the concessionaire as soon as their plant is erected have the right of entry upon al abandoned ground in the district subject to no entrance or representation iees. Sections 9 and 10 of the orde read as follows :

There is nothing contained within the provisions of section 9 nor in any other part of the order making it obligatory upon Treadgold to seil water to the miners of the district neither is any specification made a to the rate which will be charged.

The natural conclusion simply amouts to this: When Treadgold's plant is installed, if it ever is inotalid, he will have the individual mar at his mercy. Mining operations will be conducted according to tine, laid down by the concession aire and not in accordance with at rol laws which properly should go ern the industry.

This feature of the concession is in itself sufficient to warrant the cancellation of the measure. The water supply is the key to the whole mining, situation in this territory. Cheap and abundant water must be furnished for the working of the higher levels of auriferous gravels or they will lie idle and undeveloped for an indefinite period.
