HE'S NABBED

New York, July 5.—Chester Runyan, the missing teller of the Windsor Trust Co., who disappeared with nearly a hundred thousand of the company's funds several days ago, was arrested here today.

Kingston, July 5.—Willie Davy, the six-year old son of Charles Davy got hold of a bottle of gun powder, and child-like lighted a match and applied it to the powder. Blowing the bottle to fragments and burning his face and arms terribly. The little fellow will lose the sight of one eye. The house was set on fire, but the flames were put out.

1000 MILES IN CANOE

Wolseley, July 5.—H. Thompson and F. Porter left today by the Qu'Appelle river in a canoe for Winnipeg. It is estimated that they will cover over a thousand miles by the time they reach their destination. They intend making the trip in about sixteen days. They take with them all the necessary supplies.

QUEBEC ELECTIONS.

Montreal, July 5.—There is every indication that the provincial general elections will be held in Quebec by the end of September. Unwonted activity is being displayed in the Liberal camp throughout the province, a very unusual thing for a heated time while the general tone of the Liberal press also bears out the idea. Liberal meetings are being announced with a good deal of regularity, no less than three large conclaves of the "faithful" being already scheduled for the month of July.

HAIL AT SEBELY

Sedley, Sask., July 5.—A severe wind and rainstorm of unusual violence struck Sedley last evening and hail did much damage to crops. A newly built granary was blown to pieces, and a new wagon carried over a fence and smashed on an adjoining farm. At a ladies' aid meeting, at A. Ferguson's all the buggies belonging to the visiting ladies were swept away and landed in Wascana creek. Several of them were badly damaged.

GUNBOAT ON LAKES.

Washington, July 4.—The state department has received the assurance of the British government that there will be no objection to the request of this government in sending the gunboat Don Juan de Austria to the Great Lakes, where she will be used for cruising purposes by the naval militia.

TREE PROPGATION.

Ottawa, July 7.—The Dominion government is engaged in an active campaign of tree propagation, and tree preservation at the west. The officials have been busy getting the established farmers and the new settlers on the prairies to plant trees. The movement is meeting with the greatest success. By way of setting an example to the individual the government has just completed the planting of over two million trees on its own forest reserve lands in the three western provinces.

MANY DROWNED.

Vancouver, B.C., July 7.—A despatch from Kiteselas states that the Hudson Bay steamer "Mount Royal" running on the Skeena river was wrecked this afternoon in the canyon. The vessel went to pieces in five minutes. The island in the canyon is dotted with passengers. The cause of the accident is not known. A great many passengers were drowned. It is impossible to get details at present.

FRENCH TREATY

Ottawa, July 4.—In connection with the departure of T. C. Bixille, deputy minister of finance, today to meet Mr. Fielding in Paris, it may be mentioned that no trade negotiations with any European country will be opened up, until a new treaty is arranged with France. Canada has at present a treaty with France but

it is a one sided arrangement. The most objectionable feature of the present treaty is that France enjoys the privilege of not only shipping direct to Canada, but through Germany, Italy and other foreign countries, while Canada must ship direct to France and cannot get the advantage of the treaty on goods shipped via Great Britain. Any arrangement made by the ministers must be endorsed by Canada and Great Britain before the treaty is arranged and ratified.

MUCH MARRIED

Toronto, July 6.—The Star this evening publishes the following: "In a town in Ontario and now married to another man, lives a widow of the late Lord Delaval Beresford, whose estate of two million has been under administration by his two brothers, Admiral Lord Charles Beresford and Lord Marcus Beresford. She was married to the titled Englishman over twenty years ago when she was a girl about eighteen. She has all the papers to prove her marriage, and also to prove that the man she married was Beresford."

TOM KEEN WINS

Edmonton, July 4.—The closing days races at the Alberta Industrial Exhibition was fully as well attended as in former years, and those present were furnished with excellent sport. The principal race of the day was the free-for-all, won in straight heats by the Winnipeg horse, Tom Keen who gave the best exhibition of clean trotting during the entire race meet. In the 2:19 there were seven starters which gave considerable trouble to Starter Webb in getting them away.

HORSES BURN

Milestone, Sask., July 4.—On Dominion day whilst the foreman and hired help were celebrating, a barn containing fifteen horses on the farm of Alverson and Norton, caught fire from heated manure and destroyed the building and thirteen horses. Two being saved through the efforts of a neighbor. The loss is estimated at \$3,000.

COAL DISCOVERY

Ottawa, July 7.—The German Development Co., of Montreal and Ottawa, which is financed by prominent men of Berlin, Germany, have sent out an exploring party into the Rocky Mountains headed by the well known geologist Dr. Gowing. Reports have just come to hand that big coal fields have been discovered by the party near Yellow Head pass where the Grand Trunk Pacific and Canadian Northern are planning to cross the mountains.

NOT FOR FEDERAL.

Montreal, July 7.—Premier McBride, of British Columbia, arrived here on Saturday morning after a long stay in England. He flatly denied that he had any intention of entering federal politics, and that he would oppose Hon. William Templeman in Victoria. Speaking of his mission Mr. McBride said he believed he had been successful and British Columbia would receive a greater provincial subsidy.

PERRY MAKES TOUR

Edmonton, July 7.—Commissioner Perry of the R.N.W.M.P. is expected to arrive in city today on his way north to inspect the Peace River Trail. A number of pack horses to be used on the trip, have arrived. They will be taken to the Peace River crossing by Corp. Stark, to await the arrival of the commissioner and party. The commissioner will go over the entire trail to ascertain the exact condition.

White Lake

Forget, July 8.—On Sunday evening a party of thirteen persons drove to White Lake to bathe. Two of the party started to swim across the lake and no attention was paid to them until cries for help were heard. The rest of the party were then dressing but three young men, Stacey, Wheatly and Pool hurried to the rescue. Only Stacey was able to reach them and he was able to save his man, landing him on the shore but both were exhausted, but the other man, Childs, went under, a search party was sent for from town and worked from nine o'clock till six next morning before they raised the body. The young man Robt. Childs, had only been in the country about three months, emigrating with his brothers from London, who were with him when the accident happened.

FIVE YEARS
FOR SCHMIDT

Mayor of 'Frisco Convicted of
Grafting in Municipal Politics
and is Sent to the
Pen—Cheers in
Court

San Francisco, July 6.—The passing of sentence upon the convicted mayor was accompanied by a remarkable demonstration. As the last words fell from the lips of the judge the great court that stood through the dramatic scene gave up a thunderous cheer. Men threw their hats in the air, others climbed upon chairs and the greatest confusion prevailed. Counsel for Schmidt appealed to the court to put a stop to this unseemly occurrence. "If we had a sheriff worthy of the name it would have been stopped instantly," replied the judge. Sheriff O'Neil who stood inside the rail, turned to the court in protest. "No one could have stopped that cheer, your honor." Then the order was given to clear the court. In the meantime half a dozen photographers, not off their flashlights, and in the midst of the struggling crowd and suffocating smoke stood the convicted mayor dictating a statement to a half dozen news paper men.

MOTHERWELL
ON CROPS

Expects that with Good Weather
All will be Well and
Harvest will be
Great

Winnipeg, July 4.—Hon. W. R. Motherwell arrived in the city today. Speaking of the crop condition he said: "From all I have learned the condition of the crop is fully as satisfactory in Alberta as in Saskatchewan. There has been sufficient rain and the grain is in good condition, and the prospects are that with good weather for the balance of the season there will be nothing lacking in the harvest. My general statement then in regard to the wheat in Saskatchewan then, is that it is late in growth and not so far advanced as last year at the same time, but that in other regards the conditions are perfect, and that with good dry hot weather throughout the balance of the season there will be harvested an excellent crop this fall."

ULTRA VIRES

Supreme Court of Canada Re-
verses Judgment of Our
Court—Confusion
Results

Edmonton, July 5.—A deputation from the Alberta Medical Council waited upon Hon. C. W. Ross this morning to confer with him regarding the recent judgment of the Supreme Court of Canada, which declared that the Alberta Medical act, passed by the Alberta legislature is ultra vires and reversed the judgment of the supreme court of the North-West Territories. The judgment affects a number of medical men in this province, who registered in Alberta subsequent to the passing of the Alberta Medical act, and previous to the announcement of the judgment of the supreme court of Canada as to its legality. It remains with the medical council to decide whether these men will be admitted as medical practitioners in Alberta. What the decision of the council will be is not yet known. It is very likely, however, that those who registered within the above mentioned date will be required to register again and pass an examination before the medical council.

REFUSED LANDING.

Vancouver, B.C., July 5.—Dominion Immigration Inspector Monro decided not to permit the landing of Japanese from the steamer now in port, except on payment of the head tax. It is believed that many will be unable to pay and the tax will prevent their landing.

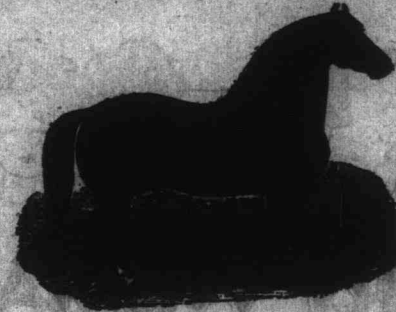
