Sir Richard Cartwright has returned to Ottawa from a trip to Boston. The object of his visit was to discuss with Mr Chamberlain matters of interest to both Canada and Great Britain.

The College work on the Hill was resumed on Wednesday under promising conditions. The attendance is to be large. Nearly all the undergraduates of last year will be back and will be augmented by a Freshman class of thirty-five or forty, nine of whom are from Wolfville.

During the past week the fall exhibitions have been going on. They have been largely attended and well worth seeing. The weather has been favorable and the fruit, root and grain exhibits have been unusually good.

Her Majesty Queen Victoria, who is now 77 years and 4 months old, has not only attained a greater age than any of her predecessors on the throne since the time of the Norman conquest, with the exception of her grandfather, George III, but she has also reigned for a longer time than any other of the Kings or Queens of England.
