

MANY SURVIVORS OF MARINE DISASTERS ARE ON WAY TO NEW YORK

The Steamer Bermudian Flashes a Wireless That He Has Thirty Men, The Crews of Three Vessels on Board, and Another Steamer Arrives With Crew Of Schooner Nettie Champion.

New York, Jan. 9.—The steamer Bermudian which at midnight was 270 miles southeast of Sandy Hook reports by wireless that she is bringing into port thirty shipwrecked sailors, the crews of three lost ships.

On Dec. 31 and was awash on Jan. 1. Only her cargo kept her afloat and with no cabin space below it was with the greatest difficulty that the crew kept from freezing. They were picked up on New Year's eve by the steamer Indrapura bound for Manila with coal and landed in Bermuda by a pilot boat.

CUT RATE OF WAGES IN PENNSYLVANIA MINES TO CAPTURE OUR MARKETS

Grand Secretary Moffatt Discovers that in some Districts Miners Are Getting Ten Cents a Ton Less Than The Scale of Rates Elsewhere, and That Conditions of Working Are Away Behind N. S.

Pennsylvania miners working for ten cents a ton less the scale of rates elsewhere in their district in order that coal can be marketed in Canada.

While in Pennsylvania Mr. Moffatt made a careful study of the conditions of the mines and found that they were not nearly so well protected as the miners of Nova Scotia.
