

EVIDENCE IN THE CITY CASE ALL IN

LAST WITNESSES OCCUPIED THE STAND ON SATURDAY AFTERNOON.

The hearing of evidence in the case of Gallagher et al. v. Armstrong et al. was concluded at the session of the Supreme Court held on Saturday afternoon.

By mutual agreement of the counsel in the action, made in view of the desire of W. L. Walsh, K.C., for the defendants, to be in Calgary today, the argument will be submitted to Mr. Justice Stuart in writing in the course of the next few days.

Stating that he recognized the necessity for disposing of the case with dispatch, in the interests of the city, his lordship declared that he would make every effort to give judgment at the earliest possible date.

In response to Mr. Bishop's question, Mr. Justice Stuart, who was in charge of the Edmonton branch, and who had been called to the stand by Mr. Bishop, stated that he had not been present at the meeting of the corporation on the 23rd of February.

Mr. Bishop paid a striking tribute to the accuracy of press reports of interviews and council meetings, when, under cross-examination by Mr. Bishop, he was called upon to verify a number of interviews and debates in council in which he had been concerned.
