Invermore Back From Labrador.

REPORTS FISHERY A COMPLETE
FAILURE.

The s.s. Invermore, Capt. Jacob
Kean, arrived back from Labrador at
12.30 p.m. to-day, having been as far
north as Hopedale. She brought
a large freight and these passengers:
J. A. Robinson, Judge Malone, Miss
Thouhey, Rev. Mr. Curtis, Dr. Hib-
bins, Mrs. and Miss Dalmier, Rev. Fr.
Dwyer, Miss Jardine and Mr. Law and
son. Capt. Kean reports the fishing
voyage a total failure, and it will be
the worst for many years. From Hopedale
south to Battle Harbor there has
been no fish at all taken since last re-
port. The trapping voyage is nearly
over and when the Invermore was
coming south very little time was
left in the water. The Invermore met
the Stella Maris at Turnavick. The
reports of the latter, however, are
somewhat encouraging. At Fanny-
yards, below Hopedale, eight school-
ers are loaded and ready to leave for
the home ports. From Turnavick to
Cuthbert and at Nuxvaek there is
some fish going; in fact there is a
good sign of cod all along the most
northern section of the Labrador, but
trapping operations are impeded by
ice conditions and there is a lot of
jiggling done.
