

Charge the Reid Newfoundland Company With Failure --- Official Correspondence.

St. John's, Nov. 13, 1918.
Editor Evening Telegram.

Dear Sir,—Some time ago it was intimated to the Board of Trade by the Reid Newfoundland Company, that St. John's freight for North Sydney, would likely be diverted to Louisburg, owing to bad loading facilities at the former port.

As this would entail a considerable extra expense to the Trade, the Council decided to try and get at the root of the trouble, and with this idea in view, on October 5th, a letter was written to the Minister of Railways at Ottawa, and a few days ago a reply was received from Mr. G. A. Bell, the Acting Deputy Minister.

Enclosed I beg to hand you copies of the letters referred to, and would be obliged if you would kindly give same publication.

Dear Sir,—From information lately received by the Council of the Board

of Trade, it appears that freight for Newfoundland is to be diverted to Louisburg for shipment, entailing extra expense to Consignees, also, in consequence of repairs being made to the loading pier at Sydney, the shipment of freight on steamers bound for Newfoundland is greatly impeded, causing considerable delay, as only ten or twelve cars are shipped per day, while at the same time another steamer is lying up waiting for freight.

As the season is getting advanced, and goods are urgently required to supply outside ports of Newfoundland before navigation to these ports closes, I am requested by the Council to ask you if you will be good enough to make such arrangements as may remove the cause of freight having to be diverted to Louisburg, and also give quick despatch to steamers loading at Sydney.

The Council trusts you will give your attention to these matters. I have the honor to be, Sir,

Dear Sir,—Referring to your letter of October 5th, to the Honorable the Minister, which has been referred to me for reply.

I do not know from what source you received the information that freight for Newfoundland is to be diverted to Louisburg. We have no such intention, or not at least until the ice conditions in the Sydney Harbor may necessitate.

With reference to the repairs to the loading pier at North Sydney. These are under way.

The difficulties at North Sydney, however, are, in my opinion, due as much to the failure of the Reid Newfoundland Company to supply steamers of sufficient capacity, or move with regularity the steamers they have had available, as to any lack of facilities at North Sydney.

It has been reported that the Reid Newfoundland Company's railway at Port aux Basques is badly congested, and we know that freight is being brought back daily from Port aux Basques to North Sydney, which the Reid Newfoundland Company have been unable to discharge at Port aux Basques, I think through lack of labour or lack of facilities.

Supreme Court.

(Yesterday, before Full Bench.)
Fred. V. Chesman vs. Bernard McGrath. Samuel Foote and the Government of Newfoundland.—Mr. Fox, for the plaintiff, moved for an adjournment of the hearing owing to the illness of material witnesses, Mr. McNelly for the defendants, McGrath and Foote, objected to the adjournment, and the Court ordered the motion to stand over till to-day.

William F. Lloyd, Attorney General, vs. Joseph Roper and Walter Jackson and John Jackson, trustees for the benefit of creditors of the estate of the said Joseph Roper. This is an action to recover \$4,650, monies had and received by Joseph Roper for the use of the plaintiff. Mr. Mews stated the plaintiff's case. Albert E. Snelgrove was sworn and examined by Mr. Mews, and put in evidence a cheque. The witness was cross-examined by Mr. L. E. Emerson, after which the Court took recess till 2.30 p.m. After recess the argument of counsel was heard, after which the Court took time to consider.

The Epidemic.

Six patients were admitted to Grenfell Hall Hospital yesterday: a man named Mitchell, his wife and two children, from Signal Hill Road; a young woman named Jessie Hewitt, of Tessier Place; and Harry Critch, of the Thorburn Line. The latter died within an hour of his admission, his condition having been hopeless when brought there.

John Strickland, who had not been in the Hall more than six hours, died at one o'clock in the morning.

Five were released, and four were removed to the convalescent ward. Two hundred and nine patients have been treated there since the opening of the hospital. Of those, 25 deaths occurred. Nearly all of these, however, were hopeless when admitted.

Germans Hastening Retreat.

ALLIED FLEET OFF CONSTANTINOPLE.

LONDON, Nov. 13.
The Allied Fleet arrived off Constantinople to-day having passed through the Dardanelles on Tuesday, the Admiralty announced. British and Indian troops occupying the forts, paraded as the ships passed.

SHOT WHILE ESCAPING.

LONDON, Nov. 12.
The Crown Prince Frederick William of Germany, was shot and killed on Monday morning by German soldiers when trying to cross the Dutch frontier, according to Amsterdam despatches to the Times and Post.

STILL ALIVE.

NEW YORK, Nov. 12.
Mme. Catherine Brezhnevsky known as the grandmother of the Russian revolution, who was reported to have been executed by the Bolsheviks on Oct. 27, is alive and on her way to the United States, according to a statement to-night by Mr. A. J. Sack, director of the Russian Information Bureau in this country.

KAISER WILL REMAIN IN HOLLAND.

LONDON, Nov. 13.
Holland will permit William Hohenzollern to remain on Dutch soil on the same terms of internment as other high officers of the German army. He has taken the name of Count William Hohenzollern and is expected to buy an estate and remain in Holland, according to an Amsterdam despatch.

The Telegraph of Amsterdam says that he was allowed to take only his personal property from his train, the non-personal property which was brought to Holland being confiscated as is usual in internment cases. Recent despatches have stated that the former Emperor had taken a carload of archives with him into Holland.

GERMAN TRAINING SHIP TORPEDOED.

AMSTERDAM, Nov. 12.
The German training ship Schlesien has been torpedoed by revolutionary warships, according to the Weser Zeitung of Bremen.

"NO MORE OFFICIALS."

PARIS, Nov. 12.
It was stated at the War Office to-day that no further official statements detailing events of the battle front will be issued. From time to time, however, there may be official reports regarding the movement of troops in occupied districts west of the Rhine.

NO OFFICIAL CONFIRMATION.

LONDON, Nov. 13.
The British Foreign Office has received no confirmation whatever of the rumors that the former German Crown Prince has been assassinated.

AMERICA HAS NO CONFIRMATION.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 13.
It was officially stated to-day that the American government has no confirmation of rumors that the former German Crown Prince has been killed.

WILLIE STILL ALIVE.

THE HAGUE, Nov. 13.
The former German Crown Prince arrived yesterday at Maastricht, according to a despatch received here.
