Note He Ate.

Not every Australian soldier can describe himself as a £20 (100) Commonwealth bank note and present imself to the Commonwealth treasury for cashing, but this currency transaction actually happened recently, writes a correspondent. A young South Wales "Digger" was lying on the battlefield of Fleurbaix when he saw a German Red Cross collecting party approaching him. Remembering that he had a £20 note in his pocket which would almost certainly disappear, he pulled it out, memorized the number, and chewed it up. When released at the end of the war he returned to Australia and told the story Melbourne. At first his tale was re garded as a good joke, but finally inrestigation was made, and it was found that on August 4, 1914, a £20 Commonwealth bank note had been issued bearing the figures memorized by the soldier. It was the only note of the series which had not been returned to the bank authorities. The defense authorities were then asked o look up the soldier's record, and it was found that he had no black mark against him, so the money was paid.

Girl Fought as Czecho-Slovak.

Anna Holokova, a Czecho-Sloval girl who fought in the front line with the soldiers of the new republic until her sex was discovered when she was severely wounded in the breast, s ranked as Czecho-Slovak's greatest hero. At the outbreak of the war, Anna Holokova, then fourteen, studied music in Warsaw. With thousands of others she was thrown into prison, suspected of being a German sympathizer. For more than a year she lay in prison until she was released. Upon the formation of the Czech army, Anna donned man's clothing as the only means of joining her countrymen in fighting for freedom. Her sex remained undetected all the time until her secret was revealed by the bullet wound in the chest. Upon her recovery the doctor refused to allow her to go back, but permitted her to remain as a nurse.

Jenkins' Ear.

If the United States is drawn into a war with Mexico over Jenkins it is no more than might have been expected. This is not the first time that a man of that ill-omened name has caused trouble between the two races. Have we forgotten the "War of Jenkins' Ear" that lasted seven years and involved two hemispheres?

Roh Jenkins was in 1731 master of the brig Rebecca, bound from Jamaica to London when she was overhauled and looted by a Spanish coastguard ship. The Spanish captain just before he left cut off Jenkins' ear and pre sented it to him as a souvenir of the visit. Jenkins did keep it and used it as exhibit A in evidence of Spanish atrocities.

For seven years he carried it about England with him, fanning the war spirit to a flame, until finally he was called before a committee of the House of Commons and displayed to them the dissevered auricle. 
