The News of the Day, Culled and Condensed.

Henry Ward, M.P. for South Derbyshire, England, is dead. He was a Liberal and a home ruler.

A St. Petersburg dispatch says a hurricane has passed over Batoum, the Russian port on the Black Sea, during great damage.

Harry Randolph Kelly, aged 9 years, died Monday night at the Johns Hopkins hospital in Baltimore, Md., from the result of a mosquito bite.

Geo. Bennett, Elmira, a rich farmer, aged 70 years, has disappeared. He went to feed his stock at 5 p.m. and never returned. He is worth \$15,000.

At a recent speech, General Davitt said that he recently learned that the Irish properties mortgaged by the English bankers amounted in value to £100,000.

Demetri Mindell, a Russian and the inventor of territic, an explosive more powerful than dynamite, is dead.

Five of the passengers of the typhus fever infected steamer, Massilia, have been located in Lawrenceville, near Newcastle, Pa., and great alarm is felt lest the infection spreads.

A heavy snow storm raged in England and Wales Monday. The storm developed into a gale at night, threatening disasters on the coast. Railway trains and mail boats are greatly delayed.

Ex-Governor Ames, of Boston, has announced himself as a candidate for Congress against Elihu Corning, New York. The nomination is not a contest between the two men.

Just after 800 people had left the Opera House at Monmouth, Ill., the building took fire and the entire business part of the city was burned.
