Indianapolis, Sept. 15.—Split-heat races ruled today at the state fair, each of the first three going beyond the usual three heats. The first race, a \$2,500 stake for 2:09 pacers, resulted in a lively contest. Merry Widow, a Canadian mare, won the first heat, and Ruth D., owned by Charley Doherty, of Elwood, took the second. Merry Widow won the third, but was forced to pace the mile in 2:03.4 to do it. She took the next heat and race. In the second race Capt. Hunt won the first heat, and Marie took the second. Capt. Hunt took the third and got the race on third and second places in the remaining heats. All three races were hard fought throughout. Country Jay took the fourth race in straight heats. Summary:
