## TO FORECLOSE BIG MORTGAGE ON P. M.

This Is the Latest Report Coming From New York During the Investigation.

Detroit, March 17.—While Senator W. M. Smith, of the special legislative committee was questioning Frederick W. Stevens about the affairs of the Pere Marquette today in the presence of the receivers who have been trying to put the road on its feet it was reported that alleged steps were being taken in New York to foreclose a mortgage on the road and sell it to the highest bidder.

The contemplated action is said to be by the holders of the \$8,000,000 outstanding collateral gold notes, for which J. P. Morgan & Co. furnished the company with \$7,500,000 in cash, and which were sold to the Guaranty Trust Company, which holds, as trustee, \$16,000,000 improvement and general refunding bonds as collateral therefor. The road defaulted in interest on the \$8,000,000 bonds on Sept. 1, 1912, and none has been paid since.

Frank I. Blair, one of the receivers, said today that the receivers had been notified that the bonds would be put up at auction on March 20 and sold to the highest bidder, who presumably will be the representative of the noteholders. When the bonds fall in their hands, it is said, they will be in a position to foreclose, which will result in a new reorganization.

Senator Smith, who acted as cross-examiner today for the committee, questioned Mr. Stevens with a view of showing whether the stock of the Pere Marquette issued in 1900 to pay for the constituent companies was water, but Mr. Stevens would not admit this, declaring that in some cases he was not in a position to pass an opinion on that point.

Senator Smith also wanted to know whether the witness thought it just that dividends be paid on stock that when issued was pure "water." Mr. Stevens refused to answer this question, saying that stock issued for the purpose of buying other lines was not throwing away money, that such purchased roads had a value as part of a new system that they never had when standing by themselves.

The inquirer also asked about the Grand Rapids, Kalamazoo and Southwestern road in which Senator and Smith was Smith was interested, and which was sold to the Pere Marquette. He wanted to know if William Alden Smith at that time was not a law partner of Mr. Stevens. The latter said he was not.

The session ended at noon and will be continued next Friday morning.

## SAYS CORPORAL PUNISHMENT IS HARMFUL IDEA

W. L. Scott, President  
Ottawa Children's Aid  
Society Speaks Here.

## HEREDITARY DEFECTS ARE ALL PHYSICAL

No Child Born Moral or Immoral, But Unmoral.

"I certainly don't believe in corporal punishment," said W. L. Scott, president of the Ottawa Children's Aid Society, in addressing the Canadian Club at a luncheon at the Teacum House Saturday night on "The Child Problem."

"Anyone who tries to govern children with his hands, makes the mistake that he has put the head to do it. Corporal punishment belongs to an age that is past, an age when it was thought necessary for the training of wives and servants. Nowadays it is not even in vogue for the training of dogs and horses."

In beginning his address Mr. Scott referred to the high standing and good work of the Ottawa Children's Aid Society. He pointed out the great expense incurred in punishing crime as compared with the cost of preventing it. Criminals are made, not born, he said.

"Children are like plastic putty. They take shape from whatever touches them and harden in time. Heredity No Direct Influence."

"Heredity has no direct influence on character, but it does influence physical defects. Delinquency is sometimes due to physical defects. Adenoids and eye strain rob the child of nerve strength."

"Ninety to 95 per cent of our delinquents are produced by environment. If every child were sensibly handled, the crime problem of the next generation would practically disappear."

"The Children's Aid Societies are doing much for neglected children, but very little for delinquents. The juvenile court appreciates the value of the child, recognizes the fact that the child's delinquency is the result of circumstances, and abandons entirely the idea of retributive justice."

A Last Resort.  
"The industrial school or reformatory should be the last resort. In the best regulated industrial schools evils arise from segregation, and there is always an artificial atmosphere. It is better, however, to send a boy to the industrial school than to allow him to go entirely to the bad."

"The juvenile court in the Dominion is required in Ontario. It legalizes the probation system, gives power to the probation officer, gives the juvenile court judge greater latitude, strictly forbids the commitment of children in prison, and obviates the formalities of arraignment and trial."

Magistrates Not Fit.  
"Generally speaking, it is undesirable to have a police magistrate act as a juvenile judge. A magistrate is stock with his own ideas, and is not a technical expert. The juvenile court assumes an entirely different view of things to that of the police court. There is also a great need for a lady as well as male probation officers."

Law's against juveniles attending picture shows, frequenting pool rooms and smoking cigarettes, should be enforced.

Athletics of Great Value.  
"Supervised playgrounds are the best means of keeping the children out of the juvenile court. Athletics, swimming ponds, and games are of great value. The ancient Greeks understood that games and exercise were necessary for moral as well as physical development."

"Municipalities in providing schools are only doing one-half their work for the education of the young. They should provide playgrounds also."

"The Government should encourage child welfare exhibits. There is economy as well as philanthropy in the work of rescuing the child. Let us not allow it to be said of us in this century and generation, 'The voice of the child cries out against you.'"

Jared Vining presided. Sheriff Cameron, of the "Playground" Association, and Inspector Sanders, of the Children's Aid Society, were among those present.
