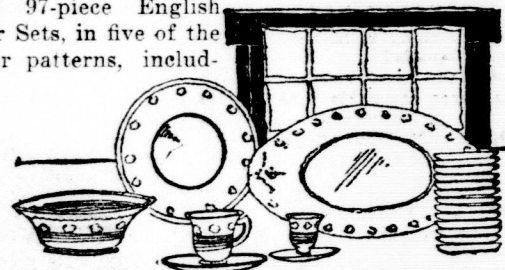

### FORM TOURISTS' CAMP IN LONDON

Public Utilities To Make Part of Wonderland Travelers' Haven.

Rule Careless Drivers of Commissioner's Trucks To Be Discharged.

Drivers of trucks or other machines controlled by the public utilities commission, who, in the future, are involved in any collision or accident whereby damage is rendered to the equipment in their charge, will forfeit their position unless they can convince the commission that the

same was not the natural result of their negligence.  
Precipitated by a recent case involving damage to the extent of \$300, a ruling to this effect was enacted by the commissioners in special session Thursday afternoon at the suggestion of Jared Vining, chairman, and following a warning to that effect earlier in the year by E. V. Buchanan, general manager.

As already anticipated the commissioners approved of the proposal to establish a civic transit automobile tourist camp, and it was recommended that the upper portion of the city's property at Wonderland, midway between Woodland Cemetery and Springbank Park, be utilized for this purpose.

It was directed that the necessary city water connections be made for domestic use, while arrangements will be immediately made for lighting and other conveniences.

The travelers will also be granted the use of the swimming pool already located on the premises. The estimated cost for operation and maintenance during the remainder of

the summer was set at \$385.

E. E. Graham, park superintendent, was placed in full charge, and was authorized to secure whatever assistance that he may require from time to time throughout the summer months.

The London Motor League will be asked to undertake the necessary advertising by erecting large signposts at the intersections of the Pipe Line and Wonderland side roads, with arrows also placed at strategic points leading into London.

The passing of accounts and other routine business claimed the attention of the commissioners for the remainder of the session. Whether a meeting will be held during August rests with the members themselves, as the chairman, Jared Vining, will be out of the city from August 1 until September, he declares.

### DISMISS ACTION IN JOCKEY CLUB SUIT

TORONTO, July 13.—On the ground that it is premature, Justice

Kelly has dismissed the action brought by the executors of David H. Bedford, Windsor, against Charles Millar of Toronto, and the Kenilworth Jockey Club.

The action was to recover \$1,147.10, balance alleged due for commission on the purchase of land for the defendants near Sandwich.  
In dismissing the action, Justice Kelly makes a declaration that the estate is entitled to judgment for \$82,400 as soon as any of the surplus lands are sold, and that the commission is payable by Mr. Millar. Commission is allowed only on lands purchased for \$400 or less per acre.

### 30,000 ISLANDS MAZE OF GREAT SCENIC BEAUTY

Residents of Ontario Little Realize Attractiveness of Georgian Bay District.

### BECKONS TO TOURISTS

Gorgeous Wilderness Patiently Awaits Crowds That Do Not Come.

Ever bored with the familiar, seeking relentlessly the new, globe-trotters have raved in turn of dazzling Oriental cities, of the rugged splendor of the Rockies, of the wondrous Falls of Niagara or of the mystic enchantment of tropical places, and have sounded the praises of a thousand and one summer resorts and beauty spots the wide world over.

After a fleeting visit but a hundred miles north of London, however, the most apathetic even must marvel in that so many years have rolled by while countless tourists and those in quest of the quiet and restful places have for the greater part contrived to either overlook or absolutely ignore Ontario's Thirty Thousand Islands, that great natural summer playground admirably situated on Georgian Bay, the outstretched arm of Lake Huron.

Particularly true is this of the people of this province, and, exaggerated as the declaration may appear at the first cursory glance, it is nevertheless an established fact that the residents of Ontario, even those of the western counties, little realize the beauty or potentialities of their own country, more especially that portion extending north from the 44th parallel of latitude.

Crowned with vegetation, fresh and captivating, the islands peep out from shimmering sun-kissed waters, beckoning imperatively to those who crave for the great and unspoiled outdoors.

**Rich in History.**  
A scenic waterway through a section of old Ontario, rich in history and legend—first traversed by Champlain—the Thirty Thousand Islands defy all descriptive powers of the ordinary layman. Those who have trod the four corners of the earth in pursuit of the beautiful have returned again and again to loaf and journey among the picturesque islands where the wildwood always welcomes and rejuvenates and never fails to send them back to the crowded cities laden with memories pleasant.

The entire district is brimming with interest, and the long summer months prove delightful in every sense, while the air of the highlands of Ontario is always dry and bracing—a sure cure, physicians assert, for hay fever and similar ailments.

There is fishing in abundance—deep fishing for the bigger fish, and fly-fishing for the black bass, while for those who are ill-content to fish there is motor-boating, sailing, rowing or bathing, and in the evening dancing and other favorite pastimes at the many hotels to be encountered through the islands.

There are, as a matter of fact, 48,000 of the latter, marked on the government charts, easily sufficient to go around, and even this figure does not include scores of the smaller ones.

**Transportation Good.**  
Excellent transportation facilities render it possible for a delightful visit for those as well who may have but limited resources at their command, no matter how short the vacation period may be.

But a day's travel from the larger cities of Eastern Canada and the United States, the excursionist finds himself in a country upon which nature has bestowed its best in gorgeous scenic effects—with islands by the dozen yet uncounted, patiently awaiting the crowds that do not come.

Midland, Ont., 101 miles north from Toronto, and reached by Grand Trunk trains, is the gateway proper to the islands, and connections are possible here with steamboats operated by the Georgian Bay Tourist Company of that centre.

The S. S. Midland City, with ample accommodation for more than 300 passengers, leaves Midland each week day, and for a distance of 45 miles winds in and out among the islands, touching the better-known resorts, where excellent hotel and other accommodation is to be had. On Tuesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays the vessel continues the journey to Rose Point and Perry Sound, 20 miles further, returning on the alternative days.

### WOMAN KILLED AS TRAIN HITS AUTO

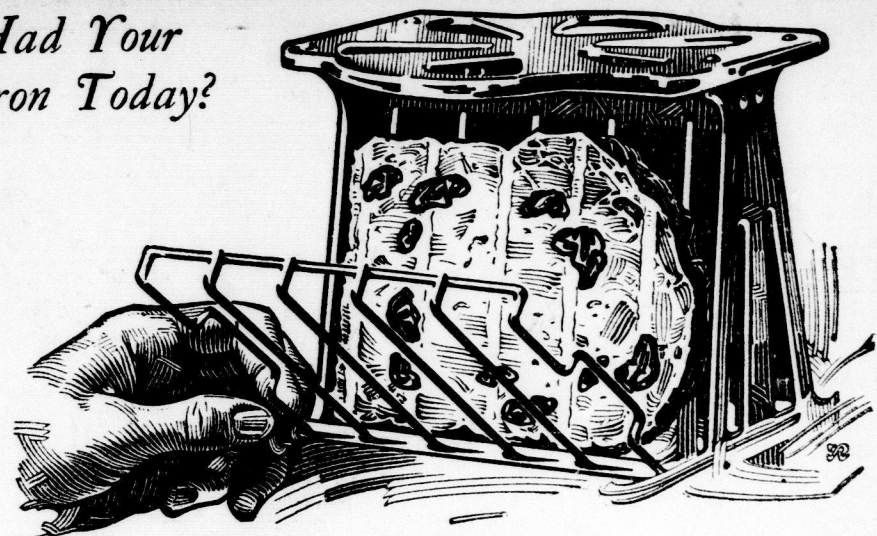
