Enthusiasts From All Over Western Ontario Attend Show At Armories.

BIG PRIZE LIST

Londoners Carry Off Bulk of Honors in First Night.

At the end of three years of steadily applied effort, nothing could have been more gratifying to the London Horticultural Society than the hundreds of peony lovers, who visited the Armories last night on the occasion of the society's annual peony show.

The show officially commenced at noon, and visitors entered in a steady stream throughout the afternoon and evening. They numbered not only professional and amateur growers, but scores of those who have developed an enthusiastic regard for the peony since it was officially adopted as London's civic flower.

Source of Interest. The Horticultural Society have striven to their utmost to make the peony show an annual event, a source of interest not only to Londoners, but to horticulturists all over the country, and in addition to give London an added prominence among cities of the dominion. The success of the exhibition this year more than fulfills this ambition. The appended prize list will indicate the interest taken by peony enthusiasts from many points outside London, and will indicate also that Londoners were able not only to sponsor the exhibition but to carry off their fair share of the trophies as well.

Wonderful Weather. The weather for the peony show is all that could be desired. Last evening was eminently cool and favorable. Opening under the most admirable auspices, the exhibition will continue today, ending this evening, after which the flowers will be distributed to local charitable institutions.

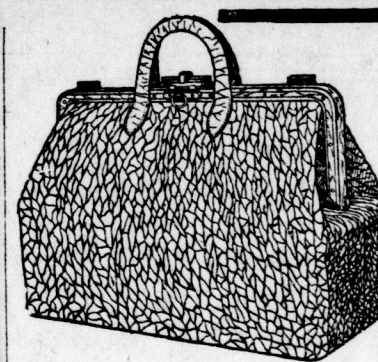

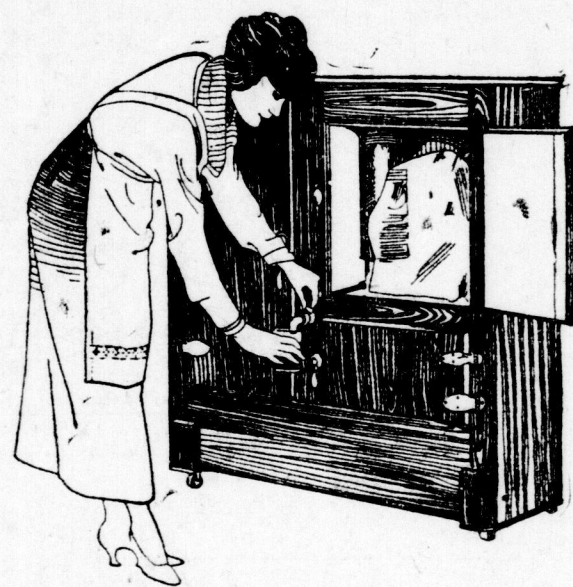
