

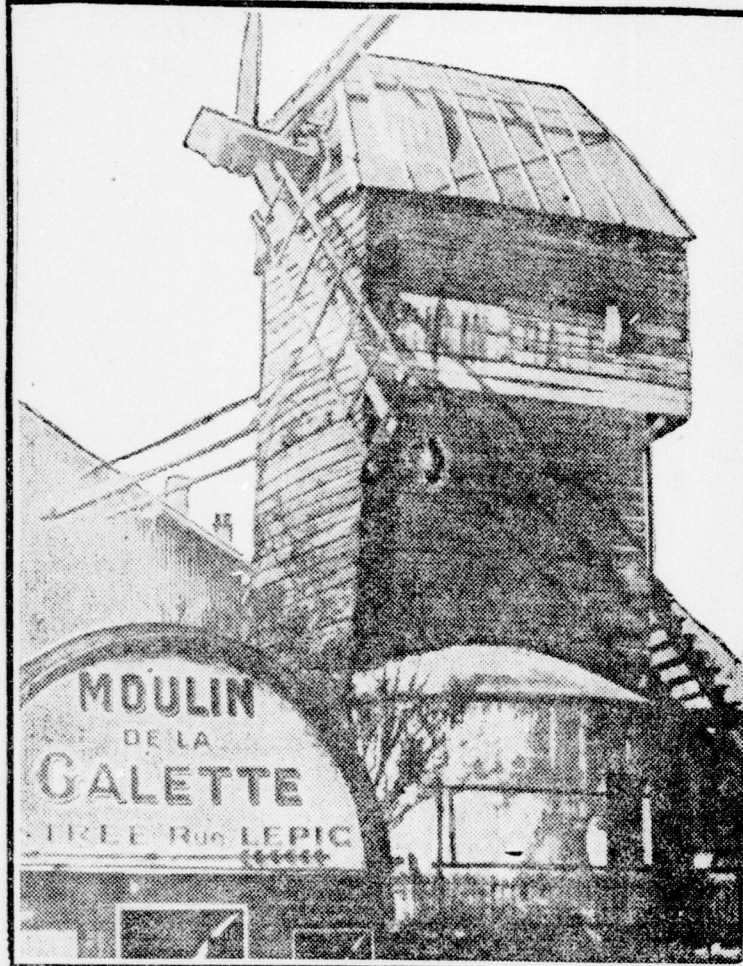
Old Windmill Moved; Teach Music by Radio; Cleans Battle Area

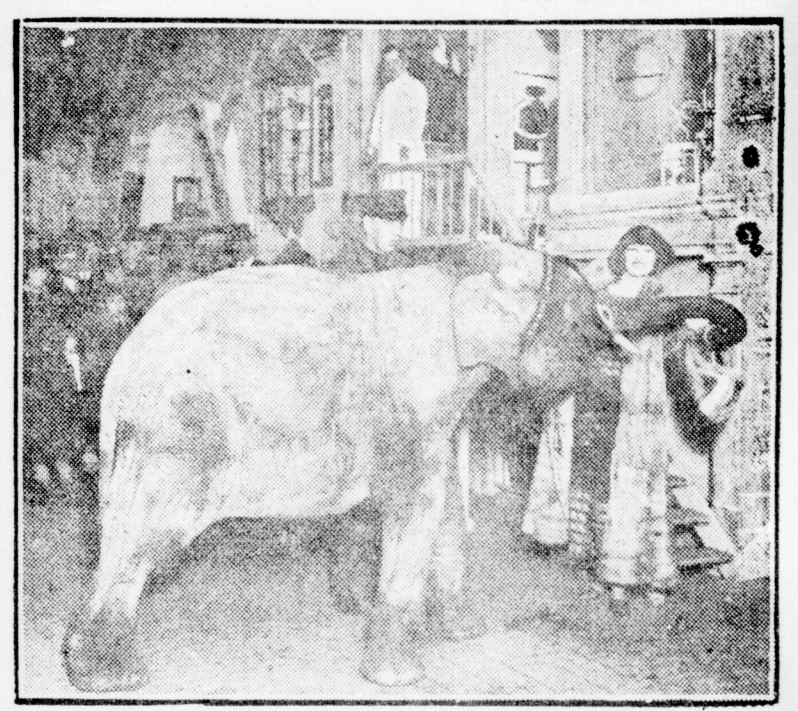

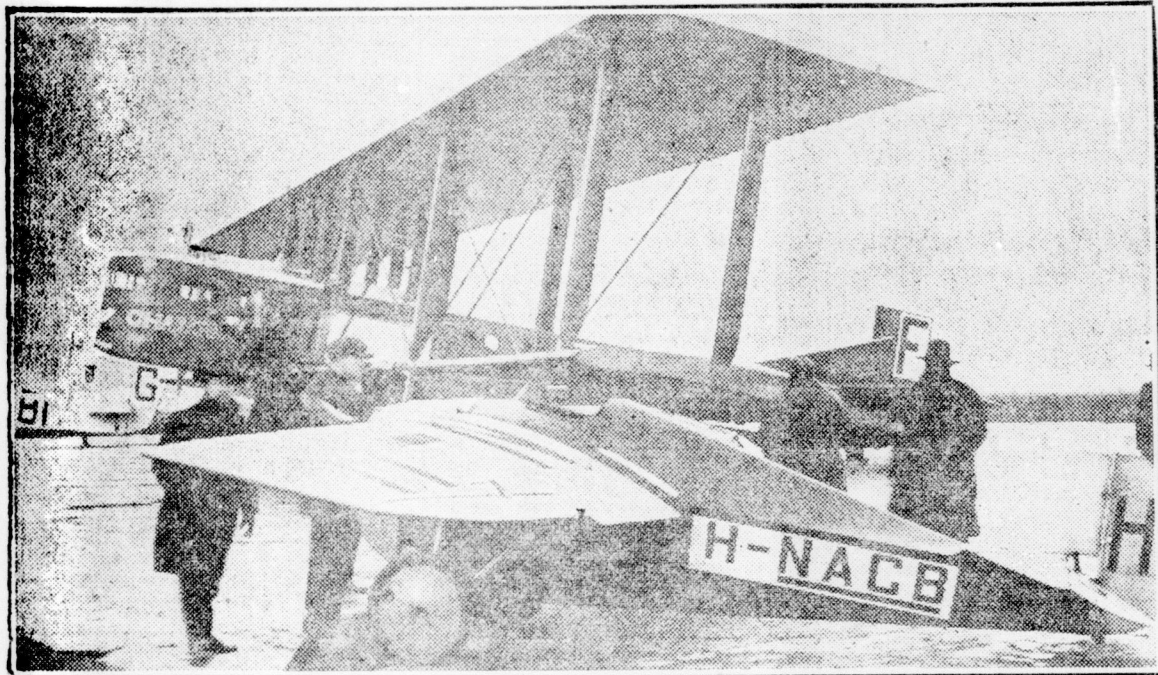

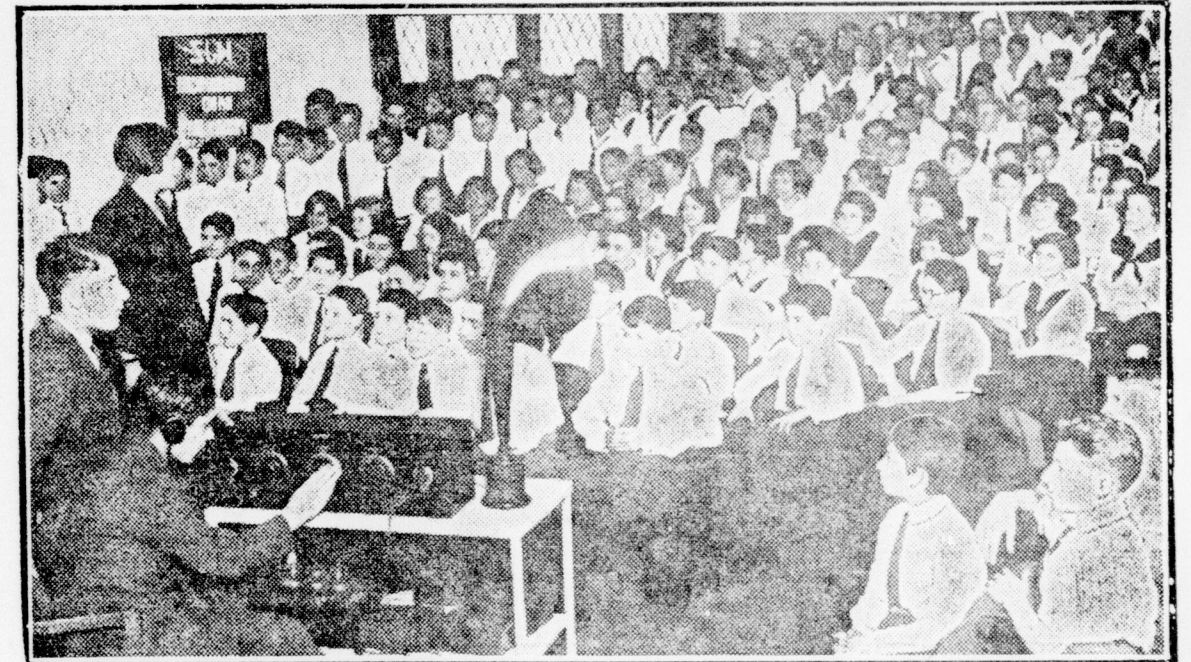

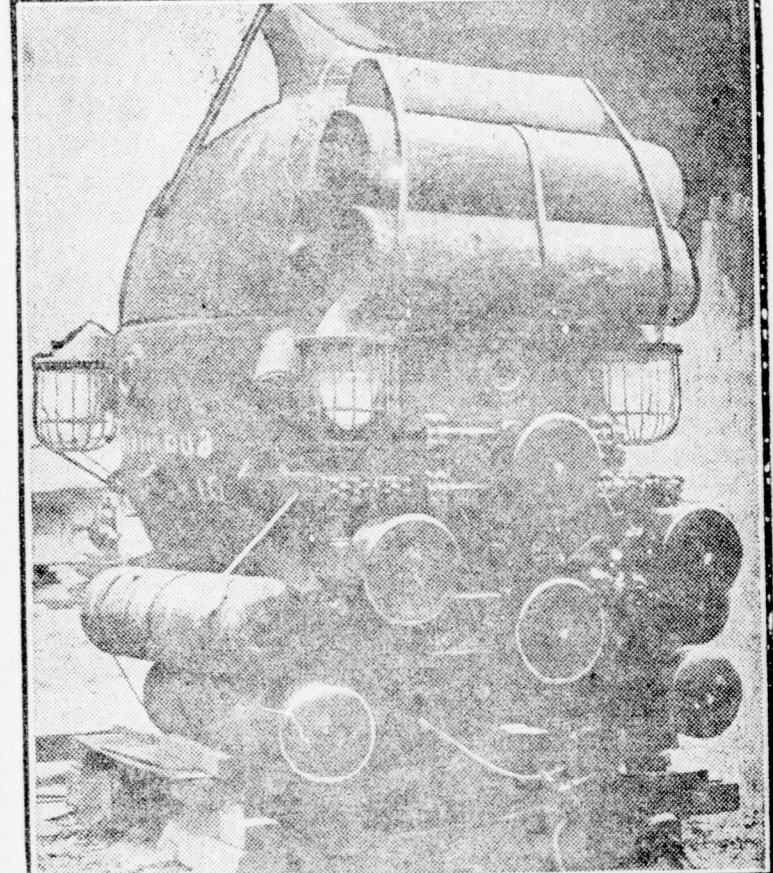

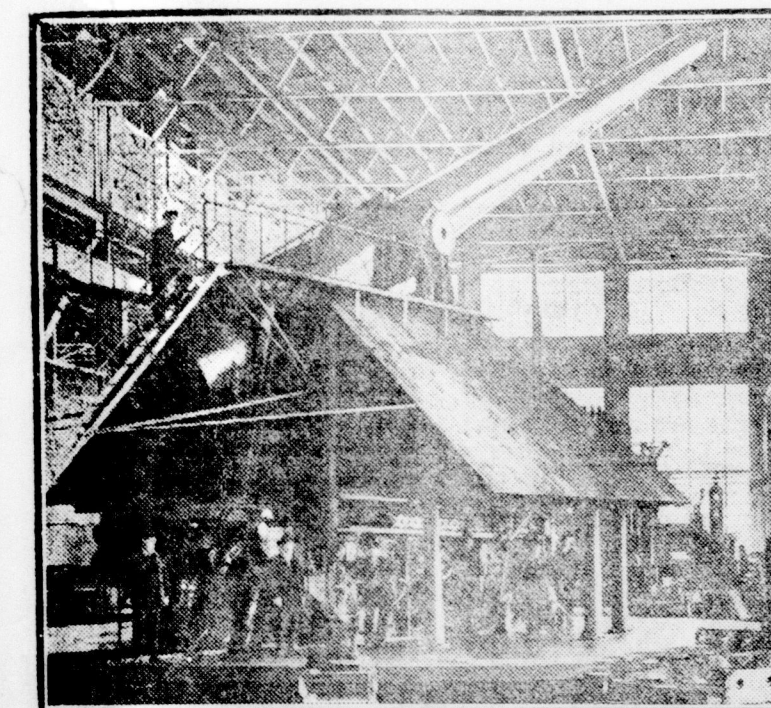
