ASK FOR Labatt's (LONDON)

Any person who is the sole owner of a family, or any made over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made by any agency, on certain conditions, by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister or intending homesteader.

Duties.—Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section alongside his homestead. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties.—Must reside six months in each of six years from date of homestead entry (including the time required to earn homestead patent) and cultivate fifty acres extra.

A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain a pre-emption may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$15.00 per acre. Duties.—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate fifty acres and erect a house worth \$200.00.

JUSTICE MISCARRIED

The acquittal of Isaac McDonald, better known here as Jack the Hugger, is certainly a miscarriage of justice.

TENDER FOR RED RIVER BRIDGE

Sealed Tenders, addressed to the undersigned, and marked on the envelope "Tender for Red River Bridge," will be received at the office of the "Engineers of the Transcontinental Railway" until twelve o'clock noon of the 8th day of April, 1909, for the construction and erection of a steel and concrete bridge and approach spans over the Red River between Winnipeg and St. Boniface, near the foot of Lombard Street, together with grading and approach spans over streets in Winnipeg.

Separate tenders must be submitted for the substructure and other works, as per schedule, and for superstructure. Plans, details and profiles may be seen and full information obtained at the office of the chief engineer at St. Boniface, and also at the office of the district engineer at St. Boniface, Man. Persons tendering are notified that tenders will not be considered unless made in the forms supplied by the Commissioners, which may be had on application to Mr. Hugh D. Lumsden, chief engineer, Ottawa, Ont., and Mr. R. P. Foulis, district engineer, St. Boniface, Man.

Each tender must be signed and sealed by all the parties to the tender and witnessed, and be accompanied by an accepted cheque on a chartered Bank of the Dominion of Canada, payable to the Commissioners of the Transcontinental Railway for the sum of \$25,000 for substructure and other works, and for the sum of \$25,000 for steel superstructure and for the sum of \$25,000 for the bridge.

The cheques deposited by the party whose tender is accepted will be deposited to the credit of the Receiver of Canada as security for the due and faithful performance of the contract according to its terms. Cheques deposited by parties whose tenders are rejected will be returned within ten days after the signing of the contract.

The right is reserved to reject any or all tenders.

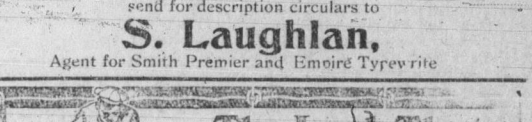
