The intake pipe, which is well screened, runs along the G.T.R. track and passes the water into the village at the Main-street bridge. An analysis of a sample taken by Mr. F. Boston, in 1893, to Consulting Chemist Thomas Heys, 130 King-street west, was by him stated to be "within the limits of a first-class water for drinking pur-

by him stated to be "within the limite of a first-class water for drinking purposes, and containing nothing of an injurious character."
