## THIEF ROBS HOME AT TILLSBURG

Second Robbery At Residence of Councilor Rush In Few Weeks

LITTLE BOOTY OBTAINED

Three Purses Removed From Hall Rack Contained Only Change

TILLSBURG, Feb. 28.—For the second time within a few weeks thieves entered the home of Councilor J. H. Rush, North Broadway, to-night and succeeded in securing only a small amount of change for their efforts. The robbery to-night was discovered by the maid at the Rush home when she returned from a concert. The thieves had gained entrance through the front door, which they left open when they made their exit.

Three purses, which were hanging in the hall, were taken, but only a small sum was contained in all of them. Snow tracks were left in the hall, and by these it is evident that the thief or thieves taken to-night was also taken on the first occasion, but later found by the police and returned to the owner.

The first robbery, committed recently, was accomplished by the thieves gaining admittance through a pantry window while Mr. and Mrs. Rush were attending a choir practice. One of the purses taken to-night was also taken on the first occasion, but later found by the police and returned to the owner.

The police are working on the case and are of the opinion that both robberies were committed by the same persons, who are acquainted with the activities of the household.

NEGLECTED TO AFFIX STAMPS; FINED \$50

Aylmer and Vienna Men Find Failure to Put Stamp On Receipts Costly.

TOMIAMS, Feb. 28.—Two men today contributed \$50 and costs to the county court for failing to put a two-cent stamp on receipts, the costs amounted to \$12 in each case. The first case of this kind brought up in this section was heard by Magistrate Maxwell this afternoon, when Leamon McEwan, of Aylmer, was fined \$50 and costs for failing to place a stamp on a receipt amounting to \$500. He had the stamps in his possession, he stated, but it was merely an oversight made in not placing the stamp on the receipt. It was a very costly oversight, he added.

The second man, L. B. Westover, of Vienna, who was the tax collector for that village, had failed to place a stamp on a tax receipt of \$15 and was also given the minimum fine of \$50 and costs. He admitted he had given out several tax receipts that did not have the necessary stamps.

Magistrate Maxwell told both men that if these receipts were contested they would not be valid without the stamps and told them to put the revenue stamps on all the receipts they had issued so that nothing more of this kind would appear.

chief electoral officer for Canada in the report to Parliament, tabled to-day.

An amendment to the Elections Act is suggested empowering the naming by the Government either of an individual or a public officer, such as the sheriff by virtue of his position, to act at all times as returning officer in his county. He would familiarize himself with conditions and be in a better position to perform expeditiously and efficiently the duties of his post at election time. The report remarks that the time required for preparation for an election

in Canada is very much longer than the period consumed in Great Britain, where the system of permanent returning officers is in vogue.

The chief electoral officer also recommends that urban registration for electoral purposes should not be required, except in certain communities where the population of an electoral district is less than 5,000. At present urban registration is required of all communities over 2,500. Exception would have to be made in the case of a few small communities which are essentially urban,

but the majority of them could be registered as rural communities and effect economy in registration. The increased population limit, says the report, would reduce the number of communities now requiring urban registration from 353 to 88.

Some minor changes in the wording of the Elections Act are also recommended. The report says that no complaints or suggestions have been received by the electoral officer in connection with the nine by-elections which were held in 1923.
