



The wheat crop of 1913 will be the greatest ever harvested in Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta, thus requir-ing the farm laborers of the East to recruit and assist in harvesting the World's

These will have to be principally recruited from Ontario, and the prosperity of Canada depends on securing labor promptly.
