Some priest of Armenians went to government and slandered him as one that is against government, and they brought him to Marash prisoner. He is sick, not in bed. I gave a telegram to consul, Z. T. Sweeney, in Constantinople, and letter to brother Shishmanian, but I have not got an answer. We give him food, and wash his clothing. Yours in Christ,


