We look upon this as a redeeming feature, that may yet produce happy days, because in whatever light it may be viewed by the Roman Catholic supporters of the present Government, it is if wisely taken advantage of, a safeguard against the political pressure of a religious body that could not be withstood, and against which the only protection is to ignore it entirely.

The French Department is under the care of Madame Florine Bringuet, who teaches on the Ollendorff system, and also gives lessons in Music. Daily conversation in French is insisted on.

Miss Mary B. Hancock (a graduate of Wyoming Seminary, Pennsylvania,) and several other Ladies are employed in the English Department, Music, Drawing, Italian, German, Mathematics, Botany, &c.

Amherst is a remarkably healthy part of the country and possesses peculiar advantages for children of delicate constitutions, and no pains will be spared to promote the health of the Boarders, by proper exercise.

Attached to the premises are a spacious "play ground," and large covered shed, containing a circular swing, and other requisites for gymnastic exercises; and those young ladies whose parents may wish them to ride, are allowed the use of a quiet saddle horse.

Pupils remaining in the Seminary during the vacation, will be charged Ten Shillings per week for Board and Washing.

Each young lady is expected to bring with her, one pair of sheets, one pair of pillow slips, four towels, and four table napkins, marked with her name.

There are six Pianos in the Establishment, and Pupils board in the vicinity will be charged Five Shillings per Quarter for the use of an instrument to practice.
