

APPENDIX 1: EEC General Rule of Interpretation, Customs Classification and Tariffs for Fish, Other Marine Species and Related Processed Products

Processed animal (terrestrial) products might also prove to be an eminently marketable product. At present it is not possible for the list of Canadian exports to France to include products for consumption alive, but we believe it will be possible to work out an agreement allowing Canadian producers to export muscle, oysters and sea urchins.

The above products are listed in the following table. The table is divided into two parts: the first part lists the products which are currently exported to France, and the second part lists the products which are not currently exported to France but which we believe it will be possible to work out an agreement allowing Canadian producers to export.
