LEBANON

Fisheries has always been a traditional sector for Lebanon and the trade enjoyed comfortable standards with the prices of seafood higher than any other country in the region. This was the case until a few years after the commencement of the civil war, the Mediterranean was rumoured to be polluted and fish not fit for human consumption. This has affected the industry greatly and for some time fresh seafood was a rare commodity. After the cessation of the civil strife, the Lebanese business men started to import seafood in addition to small quantities caught locally. Imported seafood is usually frozen and restricted to the more expensive varieties.
