Another point which may have some bearing on this particular aspect of the problem is that Canadian provinces are generally speaking much bigger than American states. This is not to suggest that all the area of the nine Canadian provinces is equally densely populated as the area of the larger states of the United States. But the larger size of the provinces may have some bearing on the concentration of population in the larger cities. The concentration of population in the larger cities is a result of the fact that the larger cities are more numerous in the United States than in Canada.
